



The word "politician" is usually linked with graft, cor-ruption and moral squalor. "Politicians" are apt to be associated with big city "machines," captained by gangsters and criminals.

Yet, every citizen is a politician.

The party "machine" comes into existence only because the voter refuses to fulfill his obligation as a politician. The party "machine" is built upon a definite number of votes, a definite number of followers to deliver that vote. If voters are few, the "machine" can be captured by the few. If the voters are many, the machine must have can-didates and policies that meet the demands of the public -victory is always the aim of any political organization. Reluctant politicians among us sometimes think they are better off as independents. In this way, many avoid what is called partisan politics. The answer to this of course is: only by working within a party can a citizenpolitician have any weight in determining policy and can-didates. The independent, sitting out the preliminaries, often finds himself faced at election time with candidates he cannot support.

The issues are political. We are all politicians. Let us be good ones.

#### A Disturbing Delay

The Moscow newspaper, Iswestija, is greatly disturbed because so many graduate students have postponed taking their final exams. No student can get a degree unless he has passed this exam but he can't take the exam until he has served for three years in a position designated by the state. Since most of these assigned positions are in isolated parts of East Russia, the majority of students like to stall the proceedings as long as possible. However, if students don't accept the assigned work, or if they leave the position early, they must accept heavy penalties

### Editorially It's All Greek to Us

Confusion still surrounds the fines recently imposed by Inter-Fraternity Council upon houses for illegal rushing. As a result constitutional changes, including rushing rules, are being considered by a special IFC committee.

Question arose over a "grace period" tried this fall for the first time. It gives rushees 24 hours to make their choice without pressure from fraternities.

The measure was approved by the IFC Executive Committee last spring too late to be presented to the council. It was not passed by the council this term. However, IFC representatives were expected to inform their houses of the rule.

How IFC-representatives were to have been informed of a ruling which they did not vote on is unclear. How fraternity rushing rules can be put into effect without the approval of IFC is just as unclear.

It would seem that Inter-Fraternity Council, as the governing body of MSC fraternities, would have to approve all rules and changes before they go into effect.

In writing the new constitution we hope that IFC will take this into consideration. They should also compile their rules and make them available to all fraternities.

Ignorance of the law is usually considered no excuse for breaking it. But when fraternity representatives do not get a chance to vote on the rule changes and little effort is made to inform them about new rules, fraternities cannot be expected to conform to them.






