Blood Drive Expected to Fall Short

Donations May Miss Goal by 150 Pints

The Alpha Phi Omega blood drive which ends today is expected to fall about 150 pints below its 544 pint quota.

Pat Dougherty, APO chairman of the drive, said that 141 pints were received yesterday and 250 pints are expected today.

All students, faculty members and College employees who were unable to register are urged to contribute today.

Before blood donations are accepted, the Red Cross will take a complete medical history, pulse, blood pressure and temperature check, and a hemoglobin test to protect both the donor and the receiver.

Before giving blood, the donor may not eat any foods containing fat, such as butter, milk, gravy or cream.

Restrictions require donors to be 18 years of age or over, to present parental consent if under 21, to have had no shots within six weeks, to weigh over 110 pounds, and not to have had yellow jaundice.

After giving blood, donors will be served coffee, cookies and milk by Red Cross volunteers.

The latest national blood drive, held three weeks ago and the East Lansing quota for 1952 have been set at 12,500 pints.

Air Battles Produce Korean War Ace; Jets Down 5 MIGs

SEOUL, Oct.—U.S. Sabre jets rampaged high over snowy North-West Korea yesterday, shooting down five and possibly seven Communist MIGs, the Fifth Air Force said.

The air battle produced the nation's 21st Korean War ace. He is a 34-year-old Texan fighting his second war, Col. Robert N. Baker of McKinney, commander of the Fourth Interceptor Group.

The U.S. Fifth Air Force announced that in addition to five MIGs positively downed, a sixth destruction claim was pending, one more MIG probably destroyed and another damaged.

Ground fighting largely while Allied and Communist artillery exchanged heavy volleys for hours across the central front.

The aerial war erupted in three separate engagements, all fought south of the Yalu River boundary between Korea and Manchuria.

4,500 Ag Graduates Questioned

A six-page questionnaire is being sent to approximately 4,500 graduates of the School of Agriculture in connection with a curriculum reorganization program in operation for the past year.

The study made possible by a grant from the Alumni Fund, is being conducted through the office of the Dean of Agriculture.

It attempts to find out what courses were particularly valuable to students in the various fields of agriculture. Whether a general or specialized course is more useful is another effect of the study.

According to John T. Stone, associate professor in Extension and Administration, who was adviser on the study, the project is designed to find out how well the present agriculture curriculum is meeting the needs of the students.

The study is one of long range planning with few immediate changes contemplated, he said. If the study shows that very definite changes in the curriculum are needed, however, these changes will be made, Stone added.

Several courses have been combined or eliminated, and some of the existing subjects have had credit increases.
