## Three Teams Top All-Foe Squad

Three of Michigan State's nine football opponents of the 1953 season dominate the All-Opponent squad selected by Spartan players and coaches.

Purdue, Notre Dame and Michigan placed a total of eight on the team, which is picked annually at the close of the grid season. The Irish and the Boilers each placed three while the Wolverines placed two. The team had one player each from Penn State, Texas A. & M. and Indiana.

Notre Dame players honored included halfback John Latner, guard Tom Neaman, and tackle Sam Palumbo. From Purdue, the Spartans selected quarterback Dale Samuels, and Bernie Flowers, and guard Fred Preszko. End Lowell Perry and Roger Zatkoff, listed as a tackle, were the Michigan representatives.

Rounding out the squad are halfback Don Ellis, of Texas A. & M.; center Jim Dooley, of Penn State; and fullback Eugene Gedman, of Indiana.

In addition six other players

were rated close to the first 11 by the Spartans. They were end Jess Arnette, of Penn State; halfback Pete Fisher, of Indiana; halfback Max Schmaling, of Purdue; guard Jack Lee, and halfback Joe Heap, both of Notre Dame, and fullback Sam Baker, of Oregon State.

Latner was a brilliant two-way performer against the Spartans. On offense, he gained 65 yards in 11 tries, while on defense, he played a standout game. Palumbo and Neaman were on the Irish defensive unit which held the powerful Spartan offense to its lowest yardage total of any game during the season.

Samuels and Flowers presented what was probably the best passing combination of any team the Spartans faced. The Purdue signal-caller completed 14 of 26 passes for 149 yards, while Flowers caught six passes for 84 yards to lead all receivers that day.

Perry was another two-way performer who stood out against the Spartans. He caught three passes for 89 yards, and one

touchdown, besides handling the safety position on defense.

Zatkoff, performing at a line-backer's position, played a strong defensive game against Michigan State.

Halfback Ellis, of Texas A. & M., was the best ground-gainer for the Aggies in their game with State. He gained 50 yards in seven tries.

By position, the team is as follows: Ends, Flowers, of Purdue, and Perry, of Michigan; Tackles, Zatkoff, of Michigan, and Palumbo, of Notre Dame; Guards, Lee, of Notre Dame, and Prezioso, of Purdue; Center, Dooley, of Penn State; Backs, Latner, of Notre Dame; Ellis, of Texas A. & M.; Gorman, of Indiana; and Samuels, of Purdue.

## Former Spartan Helps Saints' Hockey Fortunes

Michigan State hockey coach Amo Bessone rates wingman Chet Stefanowicz as one of the best collegiate hockey players he has ever seen.

The lone drawback connected with this observation is the fact that wingman Stefanowicz, one-time Spartan freshman, is now a member of the St. Lawrence University hockey squad that will provide the season opener for Michigan State at Demonstration Hall Friday evening at 8.

And the Spartans couldn't have picked a stronger opening round opponent. St. Lawrence has been rated one of the nation's top collegiate hockey teams for the past several years and this season should prove no exception.

Experience, depth and speed, plus top-flight goal-tending is once again the strength of the

Saints. They will arrive here with the additional advantage of having one game under their belts, an encounter against McGill on Tuesday evening.

Lining up for the game with the Saints, Coach Bessone will have John Thomas and Dick Northey at defense; Gerald Bergin at goal; Jack Maves at center; and George Bolton and Jim Ward at wing positions.

Thomas is the most improved player in '52, steadiest of the defensemen in early season drills. Northey, a senior and co-captain of the Spartan squad, lacks speed but is a good man around the net. Bergin, who shared the goal-tending with the graduated Del Reid last year, has gained poise and confidence and will make his first start against St. Lawrence.

Maves, chosen last year as "most valuable" although only a freshman, is a clever play-maker and should once again be a top scorer for the Spartans. Ward and Bolton are two top wingmen.

## Comic Strips May Date Back To 13th Century

ROME (AP)—Was the 13th century painter Giotto the first comic-strip creator?

Piero Bargellini, Italy's leading art critic, said in a magazine article that the series of mural paintings made by Giotto—Andrea dell'Orcagna, Agnolo Gaddi, Domenico del Ghirlandajo and other leading Italian artists were "the original comic strips."

Giotto's was the first.

He added, "then, as today, there was the need to attract the attention of the common people—the eternal children—who, unable to read, preferred to see, that is, to read by images."

The question of education by comic strips, much debated in the country and abroad, found in Bargellini a defender who said, "comic strips have an immediate grip on the fantasy of the simple ones and of children."

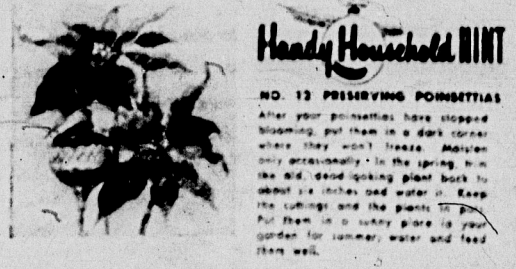

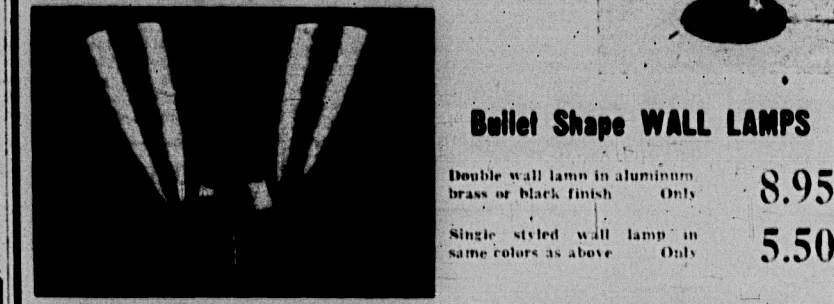

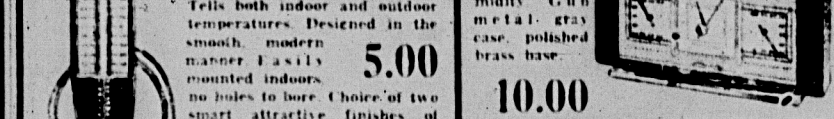
