



Missing Library Books

Michigan State's library is missing 1,500 books. They were either stolen, accidentally removed or taken by faculty members who have since moved on to other

No matter how they disappeared the fact remains that they are gone and the students are the ones who have to Although improbable, some student may flunk a course because of a need for one of these missing books, but that does not seem to matter to the people that have

Jackson Towne, MSC librarian, said that most of the missing books are probably being held by faculty members and graduate students. They are the only ones allowed to take books out for an entire year. They too, are the only ones given access to the stacks.

Under the present system, faculty members and graduate students are not required to offer their brief cases for inspection when leaving the stacks, although it seems like a harmless request on the surface.

It is relatively easy for any of these people to stick a book or two in their briefcases, accidentally or otherwise, and make off with it without anyone knowing it. Once out of the libeary, these books very seldom are returned and this may account for the 1,500 missing volumes.

At the second faculty meeting of winter term, the vot-ing faculty will be presented with a resolution-which will demand that all faculty members and grad students present their brief cases for inspection before leaving the stacks. The passage of such a resolution would be a benefit to the entire student body.

Grants for Better TV

There has been great controversy over federal aid to education. Whether institutions should depend on industries for a great share of their financial aid, or government backing has been strongly debated.

There are many, who advocate that the government should foot as much of the nation's education bill as pos sible but these people cannot deny the value of financial

contribution that will accomplish what the Ford gift will. MSC is grateful. And we hope that many other schools will be able to receive a helping hand on projects like educational television through similar aid.

Agencies affected would be the Department of Economic Development, State Tourist Council, State Waterways Commission, Great Lakes Tidewater Commission, Soo Locks Centerial Celebration Commission, State Cherry Commission, State Apple Commission, Board of Managers of the State Fair and Board of Managers of the Upper

The joint Legislative Commit-tee on Reorganization of State Government also proposed a long range plan for capital im-

provements.
Under the single department plan for premotional activities, the central agency would co-for-dinate the advertising programs of the nine agencies and furnish central secretarial and budget-

ing services.
The eight-member Board of Development and Promotion would be appointed by the gov-ernor with the advice and consent of the Senate

The present commissions, then

would become advisory coun-cils to the new department. — Under the proposal for a long-range capital improvement program, the State Building Division would establish a system of priorities for building jobs.

Instead of going to the Legis-lature, state agencies would channel their requests through the Building Division. The di-vision would then submit its recommendations for a five or 10-year building program to the
