# Iowa, Minnesota Face State in Three Weekend Games

## Baseballers Start Home Big Ten Slate

### Hope for Break from Weatherman

Michigan State's collared Spartans will attempt to climb up the Big Ten baseball ladder this weekend with three home conference games slated for Old College.

Light, intermittent rain has been predicted for the weekend, but the games are expected to be played. According to Coach Kobs, the infield is in good shape and if the rain comes, it will be a relief.

Hawkeyes will invade Spartan campus for a single today. Game time is 3:30. Green and White then play to Minnesota's Golden Gophers in a twin-bill Saturday.

At the end of the loop with a 6-3 ledger, the Spartans are faced with the grim prospect of running into Bob Dierl and Paul Giel, two of the Big Ten's top twirlers.
