

## Central Commission Cancels Interviews

Communist Prisoners to Leave Compound

UNION (AP)—The Neutral Nations Repatriation Commission canceled today's Communist interviews with North Korean prisoners, the United Nations Commission only two hours before the meeting was to

begin. An official said the reason was that "the Communists refused to accept the commission's terms of reference." A spokesman for the commission said the commission would not accept the terms of reference unless the Communists agreed to accept the commission's terms of reference.

## Red POWs Kill Inmate In Compound

INDIAN VILLAGE, Korea (AP)—A Chinese prisoner of war was killed by gunfire today before Indian guards came to parade 444 POWs through an identification lineup in an investigation of another reported murder in their compound.

After the shooting, the prisoners marched quietly before two former Chinese POWs who said after repatriation they had seen a fellow POW slain in the stockade Oct. 3.

The two Chinese singled out 7 of the prisoners as accused participants and 16 as material witnesses. The 23 were taken out of the marching line.

Two others broke from the line for the gates behind which the two Chinese "eye witnesses" were standing, shouting that they wanted to go home to Red China.

After the identification parade was finished, two more POWs dashed down the runway to Indian guards and asked repatriation.

It brought to six the number who have asked for return to the Reds from that compound since a probe began Sunday into the alleged murder.

President Hannah served as master of ceremonies and introduced the speaker, Dean Herman J. Wyngarden of the School of Business and Public Service.

To answer the question "Is high scholarship really worthwhile?" Wyngarden said, "Knowledge is a people's greatest asset and the ability to think its most important skill."

Wyngarden said that the solution to the problem of world peace must come through helping the underdeveloped nations of the world by giving them knowledge and thinking ability.

"I doubt whether smashing Russia would bring world peace because world peace depends on world progress," he stated.

Wyngarden went on to explain the new business school Michigan State is setting up in Sao Paulo, Brazil and told anecdotes of his recent trip there.

## Actors Plan To Tour for First Time

For the first time in their 48-year history the MSC Players are going on tour. "Grassroots Ghost," a two-act fantasy-mystery by John Cecil Holmes will be given before the audiences of five out-state towns.

Starting Nov. 9 the Spartan actors will play in Mason, following with Chelsea Nov. 11, Milford Nov. 12, Kelleys Nov. 13, and LeRoy Nov. 20.

The tour is sponsored by the Alumni Association in conjunction with the department of speech, drama and radio education as the first in their new Cap and Gown Series.

The Players are taking with them all the equipment needed for a performance, including lights and sets. For an 8 p.m. show, they arrive at 5 p.m. to set up the stage and lights. After the show all hands help reload equipment into their two-and-a-half ton truck.

Only 14 people, including cast and technicians, will travel with the show. This calls for dual roles, as ghosts become a stage manager and stage hands. More doubling up will occur in the lead. Joyce Buas and Elenore Jackie, Detroit seniors, will alternate as the lead and a tavern wench in "Operation Laryngitis," just in case.

The most ingenious section of the production is the "accident scene." Don Buell, associate professor of speech and the play's director, explained. Since the stage they will be using runs from 18 to 30 feet in length, the set needs extreme flexibility.

To accomplish this the set, designed by Herbert Camburn, Morenci sophomore, contains only seven pieces of furniture, including a sectional sofa in which either two or three pieces can be used, and doorways which can be widened or narrowed at will. Adaptability of players is assured by rehearsal on different-sized sets.

## Rumored Plan Called Attempt To 'Sound' U.S.

BELGRADE, Yugoslavia (AP)—Yugoslavia may offer increased military cooperation with the West in return for economic and territorial concessions in Trieste as a means of settling its fiery feud with Italy over control of the strategic Adriatic seaport.

Although it may be just a trial balloon to obtain reaction, this report was circulated, quietly but persistently, in Belgrade over the weekend by persons so closely connected with the Yugoslav Foreign Office that it cannot be discounted.

The report of the possible trading offer came in advance of a possible five-nation conference proposed by the Big Three Western Powers, with Italy and Yugoslavia included, to find a solution to the Trieste dispute.

There existed some solid ground for reports that the proposed trade-increased military cooperation, including possible participation in the North Atlantic Treaty Organization, in return for Trieste concessions—may be Yugoslavia's top card if and when the conference occurs.

While rejecting previous bids to join a common European defense alliance, the Yugoslav government has been irked by the fact that its defense requirements for arms have been placed on the list of available U.S. supplies after the needs of NATO members.

This resentment has been multiplied by two factors.

The first—and probably the most important—is Yugoslavia's claim that Italy is using its membership in NATO, under a threat of withdrawal, for applying pressure to gain its territorial objectives in the free territory of Trieste.

The second stems from the creation earlier this year of a pact with its Balkan neighbors, Greece and Turkey. Since both countries' defense programs are integrated closely with NATO and with top secret military plans involved, this places Yugoslavia in an awkward position in setting up security arrangements with its Balkan allies.

# Spartans Need 'Cooperation' for Crown

## Big 10 Title Fight Stays 'Confusing'

Conference Race May Go to Wire

It's going to take a lot of cooperation to facilitate a Big 10 title for Michigan State this season. On the part of the other conference teams, that is.

As Western Conference grid squads head into the home stretch, the Spartans are tied for second place with Ohio State. That tie will be broken this weekend when Coach Biggie Munn takes his charges down to Columbus for one of the biggest games in the nation.

State rode in the top position for four weeks until Purdue shattered the 25-game winning streak Oct. 24. Then it was time for Ray Elst's Illini to take over.

In all probability, the conference race will go right down to the wire, which is Nov. 21 in this year.

On that date, the last four Big 10 football games of the 1953 season will go into the record books.

The Illini, who started slowly with a 1-1 up tie with Nebraska, are regarded as the "team to beat" for the rest of the way. Every opponent will be shooting for that 5-0 conference mark.

Michigan, Wisconsin and Northwestern, in that order, will get cracks at Illinois. If the Wolverines fall this weekend, the Illini still must face two of their greatest rivals.

Ohio State holds the "job" in the Big 10. The Buckeyes and Minnesota's Gophers meet on a conference game. That factor could mean the title for OSU.

If, for instance, Ohio State and Illinois closed the season with only one conference loss apiece, the Buckeyes would take the hunting with a 4-1 record. The Illini would show 5-1 as one of the eight Big 10 teams with six conference games.

It is still possible for State to take an undisputed crown in its first year of competition, but every card must fall in the right place. Here is what must happen:

1 — The Spartans must defeat both OSU and Michigan, their final two conference opponents. This would automatically eliminate both the Wolverines and the Buckeyes.

2 — Illinois must lose two of its remaining Big 10 contests, an occurrence which would give the Illini a 4-2 record for the season.

3 — Wisconsin's Badgers, still in the running with a 2-1 record, must fall once more to a conference opponent. Northwestern, Illinois and Minnesota battle the Badgers in that order during the last three weeks.

4 — Wisconsin, however, is ineligible for a trip to the Rose Bowl. The Badgers had to Southern California, 7-0, last Jan. 19 for the Big 10's first defeat in the modern series.

If the Illini lose only one conference game, an assumption that is more than likely, the Spartans could tie for the title if they defeated Michigan and OSU. A 6-0 mark for Illinois, of course, would rule everyone else out.

Michigan, tied for fourth with the Badgers, can't be counted out either. But the Wolverines face the toughest trio of contests in the conference. They oppose Illinois, Michigan State and Ohio State on successive weekends.

Only one thing will decide the outcome: a reliable coin.
