## Traditions Surround ROTC Ball History

When the ROTC Officer's Club began in 1908 it brought to MSC's campus an event that has endured through the years as one of State's traditions, the Military Ball.

Now called the Coronation Ball, this year's dance Friday night will be the 50th such affair. The expected attendance is over 4,000 people, a far cry from the 100 people that danced in the Army at the first ball in 1908.

The dance moved to Dearborn in the early forties. War came and the cadets were wearing khaki overalls. The dance was cancelled from 1943-45. After the war, the event returned to its place at MSC and was named the Coronation Ball. It then became an annual occurrence in the Auditorium.

The armed forces soon were unified and so was the Coronation Ball.

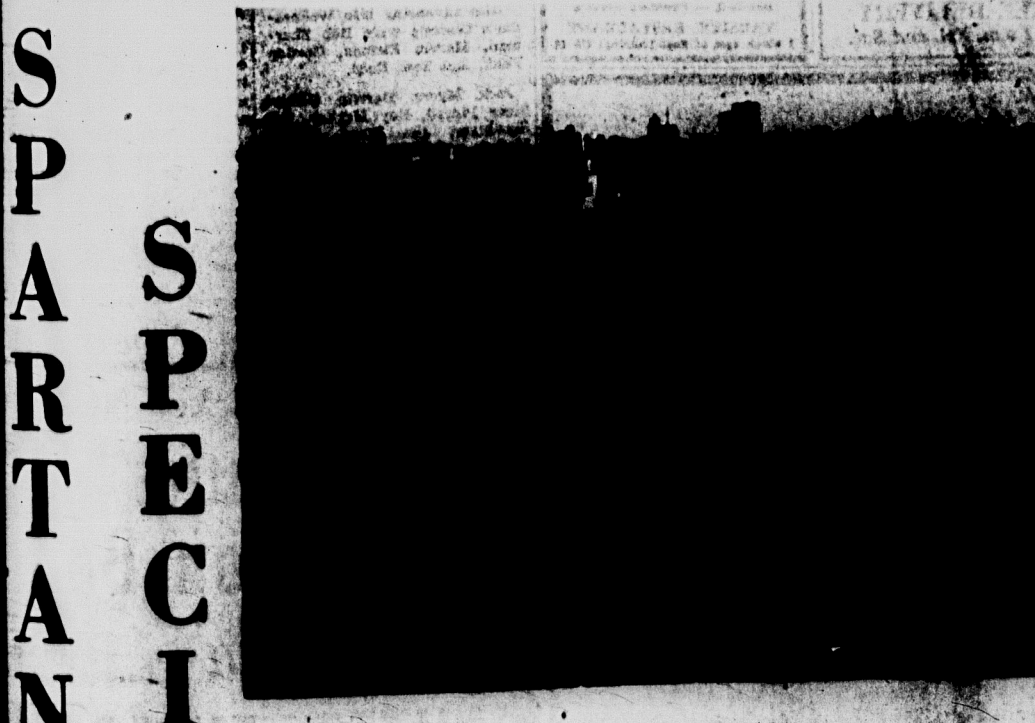

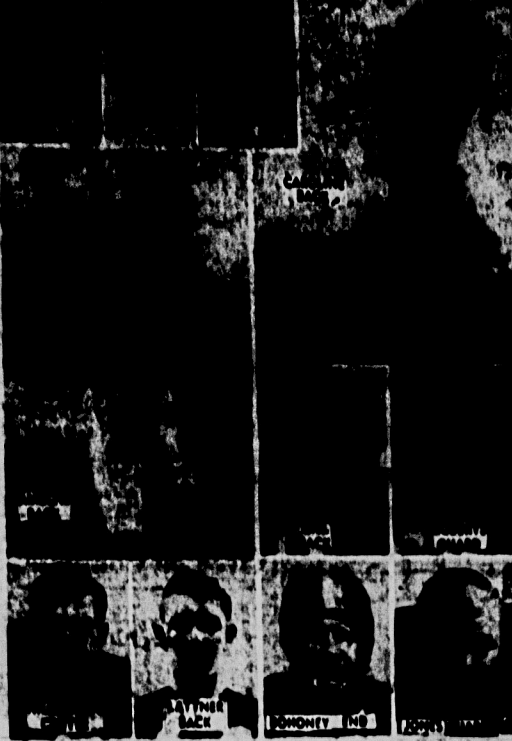

Michigan State's 1953 football team was voted third place in both of the final United Press and Associated Press polls.

It marked the third straight year that the Spartans were among the top three teams in the country. In 1951, State finished in second place, advancing to the number one position last year.

Maryland replaces MNC as the national championship team. The Terrapins barely edged Notre Dame for the honor. UCLA, the Spartans' Rose Bowl opponent, finished in fourth place in the UP poll, and fifth in the AP poll.

## All-Western Reaps New Honor

By the Associated Press Football. Capt. Don Doherty landed a position on the star team Tuesday to add to his growing list. Already honored by four major All-American guards, Doherty was named to the Associated Press all-western football team.

Letty Hiltner was placed in the AP's second team of the year. Hiltner was named to the third squad.

Cluttering with one of the strongest backfields ever produced by the area, the team was led by Notre Dame with three honored players.

Right tackle contributed to the national team which has for its members Paul Giel of Minnesota, Johnny Lattner of Notre Dame, J. C. Caroline of Illinois and Alan Amelch of Wisconsin.

Co-champions Illinois and Michigan of the Big 10 and Ohio State, Big Seven, each placed one man.

Iowa, which held Notre Dame to a 14-14 tie in perhaps the season's most dramatic game, surprisingly placed two stars from its brilliant line—center Jerry Hiltner and guard Calvin Jones, who with Caroline won a coveted all-western berth as a sophomore.

The honor team, selected by the AP after consultation with coaches, sports and sports writers also included Don Penna and Art Hunter of Notre Dame at end and tackle, respectively, J. D. Roberts of Oklahoma at guard and George Jacoby of Ohio State at tackle.

The honored quarterback post goes to Giel, who although a tailback, cutted signals for Minnesota's Gophers. Giel, winning all-western stardom for the third straight year, closed his career as the only college player in history to handle the ball more than 1,000 times over three seasons. The Gophers great handled the ball 1,056 times and set three Big 10 records this year.

Caroline won plaudits as Illinois' greatest ball carrier since Red Grange and broke Grange's overall offense record for one season. Caroline, angular speedster from Columbia, S. C., led the nation in rushing with 1,256 yards on 194 carries.

## Russian Delegate Tosses Counter-Charges at U.S.

LANSING, N. Y. (AP)—Russia's Andrei Y. Vishinsky, charged as "booth" the American charges of war crimes against thousands of soldiers and civilians in Korea. He counter-charged that the American and South Koreans committed many war crimes.

American Chief Delegate Henry Cabot Lodge Jr. promptly challenged the Soviet top delegate to permit an impartial commission of inquiry full access to all of Korea and China to learn the full facts.

Lodge previously had not asked for a commission because the Americans assumed the Russians would not let it go behind the Bamboo Curtain. They still do not expect Russian approval for such an investigation.

Vishinsky attempted in his speech to punch holes in the documents put before the Assembly by Lodge.

These contained sworn statements by survivors of death marches and memoranda and interrogations of Communist prisoners alleged to have taken part in a number of the reported atrocities. Lodge said there were 38,000 victims.

Vishinsky claimed there were many points not settled in the documents. He declared that killings reported to have been committed by North Koreans and Communist Chinese actually were the result of wholesale bombings by American planes.

He charged that Americans wiped out cities such as Taeyon and in doing so killed many women and children.

Vishinsky declared the atrocities item is a "flagrant concocted fabrication, redolent with slander and a recital of events which never took place."

He charged it was part of psychological warfare intended to blow up the peace negotiations in Korea. He said the whole story is an "unprecedentedly cynical maneuver" carried out by Lodge.

Vishinsky said no "decent and peace-loving man" could support a resolution introduced by the United States, Britain, France, Australia and Turkey.

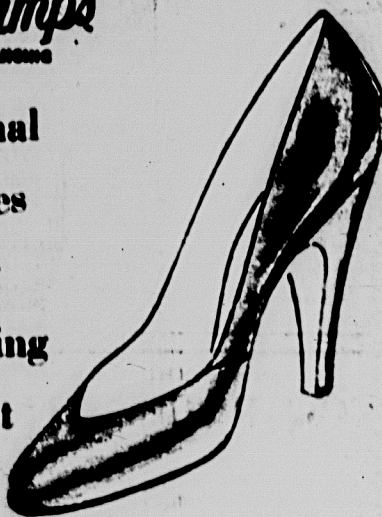
