## Peace Progress?

After weeks of intense and mentions bilter wrangling, the U.S., Russia, France and Beltain have agreed to begin a Big Four foreign ministers' conference in Berlin Sunday. Spokesmen for the four countries broke off talks in Berlin Thursday when they couldn't agree on a site for the talks.

Russia insisted on holding at least half of the conference sessions in East Berlin, while the three Western powers held firm to keeping three-fourths of the talks in the former Allied Control Authority Building in the American sector of West Berlin. The problem was referred to the government level. There

the mountain grumbled and a compromise crept forth. The four powers resorted to the international language of math-ematics, aided by statistics on how far each side could be moved, and came up with a new formula: One-third of the talks will be in East Berlin, the rest in the American sector.

The Russians can take astisfaction from coming out one-sixteenth ahead of the Western powers.
