Students Must Learn Poli Sci

requiring all students attending "state schools using public money" to take three semester hours of political science before graduation.

The bill was another step on the road of political awareness that the American public is following during this era of the Red-scare.

It is obvious that college graduates should have a background in the government of their own country. However, the passing of the bill brings to light two other sides of the question.

College students throughout the nation are chanting credo expressing their desire to learn the art of adult living while they are learning the fine points of their coming life work. Yet, in a state like Michigan, the legisbuture still feels the need of making it compulsory to learn the political rules governing this adult life.

It's about time the students took part of the training for adult life into their own hands and studied a few of the "tough" courses that would enable them to discuss current affairs in an intelligent manner rather than to waste their time on the "snaps" that fit into their class schedule and leave time for an afternoon swim or a few lines of bowling.

Which brings up the second angle of this problem. Just how much can a student learn in three semester hours (four term hours) of political science? Perhaps they can pick up the terms that are used in the daily newspapers and learn how to mark a ballot.

But, how do they learn the inner workings of the parties that are putting the men on the ballot or the methods of correcting situations that breed conditions for

Edward W. Weidner, head of the political science department, remarked; "In view of the findings of the reent public opinion tolls concerning the dearth of knowledge that citizens possess about their government, this act represents a very sincere effort by our legislators to bridge a serious gap in the education of our future voters.

Admittedly, the effort is sincere. The only embarassing part of the action is that college students have neglected this avenue of knowledge so much that the action was necessary.

It is to be hoped that the neglect will be corrected by xtending political science study to all college students. Subjects like World Communism, pressure groups, and state and local government would be a good start.
