

After a tough, uphill climb, Christman City has at la ade its appearance. made its appearance.

made its appearance. The cooperative Yule decoration project, and the student government and the East Landing Mercula Association, had to survive several discouraging settle before making its debut Saturday night.

The idea was first proposed as a way to counterest bad feeling between East Lansing townspende and students, caused by destruction of Christmas displays during last year's holiday season.

Planners believed Christmas City would provide a more solid basis for coopenation between the city and the college. It also would be a colorful and fitting observance of Christmas traditions.

In spite of its worthy motives, however, the project was met with general disinterest or disapproval.

Original plans had called for individual living units to compete in building displays for trophles offered by the Merchants' Association. This idea was scrapped after Pan-Hel and IFC voiced their disapproval, and prohibited the individual sororities and fraternities from taking part.

For a while, it looked like Christmas City would go the way of other short-lived dreams. Then interested Spartans and East Lansingites revamped the project.

But the troubles weren't over yet. The Men's Inter-Dorm Council, which had previously given its wholehearted support to the idea, abruptly withdrew. Fortunately, work on its display was taken over by East Shaw dormitory.

A final disappointment came when Delta Tau Delta and Pi Beta Phi, sponsors of the Christmas Sing, refused to change the date of the Sing to correspond with the Christmas City lighting ceremonies.

Difficulties or no difficulties, however, the seven scenes of the Nativity are now on view on the Grand River traffic islands. They're not particularly attractive or impressive, but at least they're a start in the right direction.

And they show that cooperation between MSC and East Lansing is possible.

We're glad to see Chrismas City made it. We hope that, with expansion and improvement in future years, it will become a worthwhile MSC tradition.
