Because of Finals **Graduation**? Missed 1

"Sorry, Mom, I didn't go to Commencement last night. was studying for my finals."

Ridiculous? Not very, when you consider the number graduated seniors who either didn't attend graduation onies Monday night or rushed home to hit the books or finals beginning Wednesday.

There's something incongruous about this situation, to my the least. The pilots get their wings, but they can't Ty until they puss five or so more flight tests.

True, it's not the first time it's happened. For years fall and winter term graduates have graduated and then one back to the college study grind.

It's happened before, but that doesn't make it right. Graduation is supposed to be the end of the college workthe end of four years of grinding out term reports, getting up for 8 o'clocks, sitting through lectures.

The trick, of course, is for Spartans to arrange their lege life so they can graduate spring term. For spring term graduates don't have to take finals after they gradu--ate.

They often find that their mid-term exams are weighted heavier or they are given an early test which might be the equivalent of a final. But they graduate with no. strings attached. And they attend their Comme exercises.

It has been suggested many times, and repeated last year, that MSC's faculty get behind this oddity and regulate graduation so that everyone will take their finals before graduation or not at all.

Spring term that is done. Why not all three terms?

The essential point is the fact that many fall and winter term seniors, with the burden of studying for finals, decide to skip graduation in order to study.

And after four years of academic work, graduating seniors deserve to go to their own Commencement without worrying about someone taking their diploma away a week later.
