Russians Keep Issue On Germany Alive

Propose Troop Withdrawal; Big 4 Still Deadlocked

GENEVA (4) — The Russians kept alive the European security issue in the deadlocked Big Four conference with last minute proposals Wednesday.

They would pull out half the foreign troops in Germany and sign a nonaggression pact between the Eastern and Western military blocs.

The new offer interrupted attempts by the three Western foreign ministers to end negotiations on the first agenda point — European security and German reunification.






