VIENNA (AP)—Soviet military might apparently smashed Hungary's freedom movement Sunday. The Russians installed a Communist government patterned after the new Polish regime.

UN Orders Withdrawal Of Russia

Assembly Condemns Soviet Aggression

UNITED NATIONS, N.Y. (AP)—The U.N. General Assembly Sunday night condemned the Soviet Union for its military intervention in Hungary and ordered the immediate withdrawal of all Soviet forces from Hungarian territory.

But the Communists acknowledged Hungarians still fought Russians in the rubble of Budapest. The Hungarian capital was caught in a vise of armor by the sudden Soviet onslaught launched before dawn Sunday.

The U.S. State Department said the Soviet Union's action was a "gross violation of the U.N. Charter and the principles of international law." It called for a "complete and unconditional withdrawal of Soviet troops from Hungary."

Sweeping aside the plea of Communist Premier Imre Nagy for friendly, neighborly relations on a basis of equality, the Russians struck before dawn. Armored units clanked through Budapest streets to seize the government seat in the Parliament building.

WASHINGTON (AP)—The Russian assault on Hungary Sunday was the "most savage ever launched," U.S. officials said. The attack was described as a "gross violation of the U.N. Charter and the principles of international law."

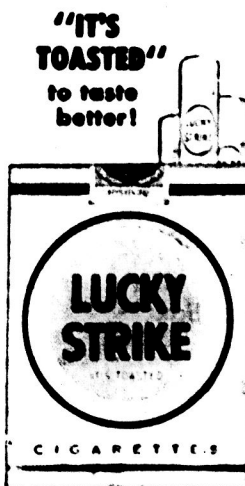

A Kremlin clique of Stalinists including ex-Foreign Minister Molotov has been reported opposing Khrushchev's policies.

Most officials agreed that the British-French military attack on Egypt undoubtedly was a critical factor in the Soviet decision to order Red troops, tanks, guns and planes unleashed against the Hungarians.

Kremlin leaders may have decided, they said, that if international morality was to be suspended for a while in the Middle East, Russia too might as well solve its Hungarian problem by brute force, figuring Russia would look no worse than Britain and France in the eyes of the world.

On the other hand, some officials reasoned that Khrushchev himself might have agreed to or initiated such a policy of flip-flop to seize advantage of an unexpected opportunity.

The savage impact of the Russian attack, authorities stressed, cast a dark shadow over prospects that an easing of East-West tensions since Stalin's death would lead to friendlier relations based on a new Soviet understanding of world opinion and respect for international agreements.

State Department officials, however, said Hungary's internal situation, freed only a few days from arrest, has been given asylum in the U.S. for a time in Budapest.

Tuesday from house arrest in a heavily guarded castle, took refuge in the U.S. legation in Budapest.

From early morning until it was silenced in midmorning, Radio Budapest reiterated Nagy's appeals for aid. Telephone and telegram line from Hungary to Austria later went dead, apparently snapped by the Russians.

Refugees, some wounded, streamed across the Austrian border in a snowstorm. Many of the men only escorted weeping wives and children to the line, embraced them and turned back to join the rebel lines facing up to Soviet steel.

About 6,000 were estimated to have made it into this neutral nation when the pattern of Russian troop movements across western Hungary cut off most of the flow.

One to escape was Mrs. Anne Kethly, 66, the Hungarian Social Democratic leader and a member of Nagy's latest government. A visitor in Austria, she crossed the frontier to return to Budapest this morning but was persuaded by the rebel garrison of Sopron to turn back as "the last member of the Hungarian government to stay on free soil."

She planned to go to New York and plead before the United Nations for Hungary's freedom in Nagy's name.

The Russian attack was launched in some areas at 2 a.m. a few hours after the Hungarian and Soviet tanks opened tank and aircraft attacks for the withdrawal of Soviet troops from Hungary.

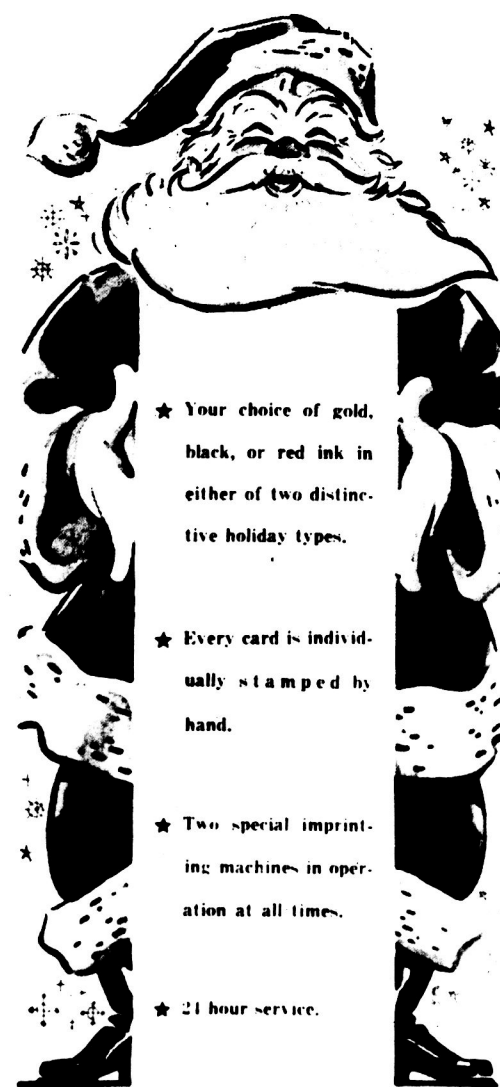

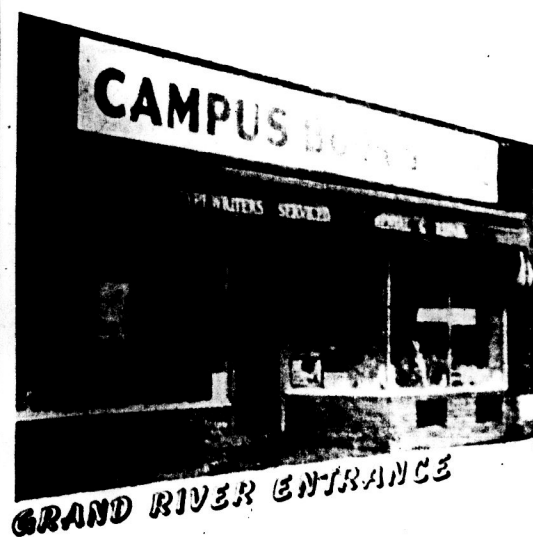
