Heppinstall Starts 43rd Year at State

Now in his 43rd year at Michigan State, Head Trainer Jack Heppinstall has nursed the aches and bruises of probably more than 10,000 athletes, and has worked with 13 football coaches.

He came to MSU in 1914 and has kept longer than any other member of the present coaching staff.

A native of Indiana County, Pa., Heppinstall came to the University in 1914. In England he was a swimming coach and a tennis player, and also had experience in the field of athletic training.

At MSU his job has been seeing to the physical welfare of all athletic teams in the prevention and care of injuries. Up until 1948 he was also in charge of all athletic equipment.

Heppinstall has watched many changes in the program at MSU and has seen many changes in the college athletic scene during his

more than any other school in the country. When I came here I was the third full time man under Coach Mackie, who was our head coach and athletic director. Now we have 60 full time men in the athletic department."

He now has four student assistants and two full time men, Fred Duthie and Guy Rounseville.

The total enrollment has increased from around 1200-1400 students at that time to over 6000.

"It keeps on growing, just like snowball," Heppinstall says, "but the changes have been for the best."

Having lived in two countries and traveled a good deal, Heppinstall has seen many different schools in many different places, but says that for him there is just "one school" and "one country."

Heppinstall has noted changes in the field of other sports, and the one he has become most interested in is soccer. We have made great strides here so that the major sports are attracting a whole new wave of spectators. I think it's part of two, three, and even four years, but that it is much harder to say.

In 1948 Heppinstall was one of the seven coaches with the United States Olympic Team and has been with two Ross Boardman panels since last summer. In a post-preliminary race in Atlanta, Georgia, Heppinstall found that officials in 1948 and in 1956 were one of the most well known names in his field.
