Williams Elected for Fifth Term

Cobo Concedes Election at 4 A.M.

Gov. G. Mennen Williams today won his fifth straight term in office with a comfortable edge over Mayor Albert E. Cobo of Detroit.

Cobo conceded at 4 a.m. after trailing for most of the night and the early morning.

Williams appeared also to be leading with him to victory the entire administrative team.

At 4 a.m. Williams was leading Cobo by 1,003,393 votes to 1,209,549.

On the local scene, Republican Charles Chamberlain held a slight edge over incumbent Don Hayworth for the 6th District representative post. Chamberlain held a 3,000 vote edge with 245 of 273 precincts.

Also leading were Democrat Paul H. Bagwell, head of MSU's Civil Skills department, appearing first in breaking into the Democratic sweep.
