# Jets' Noise Causes Deafness

WASHINGTON (P)-Deafness attributed to jet plane noise is causing the government great

veterans Administration of-ficials said the number of af-fected servicemen and veterans is increasing. They said the noise also may be affecting num-bers of civilians, just as constant and excessive exposure to noise in heavy industry is affecting many workers.

in heavy industry is affecting many workers.

Persons in the Air Force primarily affected by the jet plane noises are not the pilots but members of ground crews—planes in flight travel so fast they leave the sound behind.

The VA is presenting paying out \$59,355,672 a year to 94,233 veterans in disability benefits for hearing loss and diseases of hearing.

The increasing number of to-tally deaf veterans, due to ex-posure to jet noise, caused the VA last June to revise its dis-ability payment schedule for deafness.

The revised schedule grants persons suffering from noise deafness higher rates of com-pensation than had been the general rule previously for per-sons who could be helped by de-vices!

Russia Defies UN. Refuses Cooperation

UNITED NATIONS, N.Y. As - A special truth committee to investigate the tragedy of the Hungarian revolution was created Thursday by the UN Assembly despite Soviet refusal to cooperate in any manner.

The assembly voted 59-8 for a resolution introduced by the United States and 23 other UN accubers setting up a committer composed of Australia, Ceylon, Denmark, Tunisia and Ura-

ion, Denmark, Fullish and Oraguay.

The committee was ordered to
cearch out the facts anywhere it
could and report back as soon
as possible. It cannot go inside
flungary nor any fleet blor counry since Moscow continued its
stubborn policy of defying UN
actions and resolutions on Hun-

Ten countries abstained on the vote. Cuba was one, insisting that the action was not nearly strong enough to meet the attuation. The others abstaining were Afghanistan, Egypt, Fintand India, Jordan, Naudi Arabia, Nudan, Nyria and Yugo-lavia.

Hungary was absent from the entire debate, continuing its toport of the assembly when its toport of the assembly when it deals with the Hungarian revolution. Others absent when the voice was taken were the Union of South Africa and Yemen.

U.S. Chief Delegate Henry tabol Ledge Jr. had urged the assembly to approve the resolution as a way of ascertaining the truth about Hungary. He acknowledged the action might appear mild but said the truth sout be known and the truth will prevail. He was joined in that view by Britain's new assembly delegate, Commander Alian Noble, and a parade of other speakers.

His name was not immediate-by available here, but at the Living Air Force base at Lime-atone. Maine, the survivor was identified as Lt Joe L Church, co-pilot. Church's address was not given. No other names have been released yet.

The accident occurred near Andover, New Brunswich Pro-vince, about 10 miles east of the international boundary and less than 20 miles from the Lime-

tione base.

The report quoted the auriving officer as saying that after the "eight-jet awept-wing bomber had been placed in the unusual position—either a steep climb or a steep downward glide—he heard a loud noise and found himself alone in the air. The Limestone Base said, the plane exploded in the air and crashed in pieces.
