JERUSALEM (A)-Prime Minister David Ben-Gurion ended debate Monday and ordered Israeli troops to get out of Gaza and Aqaba coastal strips.

The grizzled Prime Minister's tion, before he had informed Parliament, set off a clash, be-

Parliament, set off a clash, between police and demonstrators—mostly students—who angriy shouted, "stop the withdrawal" A crowd of hundreds marched toward the Knesset (Parliament) building in Jerusalem shouting for Ben-Ciurion's government to resign. One of the marchers was injured and about 10 arrested in a police charge.

Police used clubs to subdue the crowd and threw up a comon that stopped the march on

Under Ben-Gurion's orders, Maj. Gen. Moshe Dayan, Israeli Maj. Gen. Moshe Dayan, Israeli Army Chief of Staff, flow to Isyada Airport an central Israel and held a 70-minute conference with Maj. Gen. E. L. M. Burns, Commander of the UN Emergency Force (UNEF).

Burns announced agreement on plans for the Israeli to pull out of the territories and for UN forces to move in, but gave no details.

A Swedish unit of UN troops is at Rafa area and may move into Gaza. Danish and Finnish troops are about 37 miles west of Sharm El Sheikh.

Israel's evacuation of the Gaza Strip of Palestine will be the third change in rule for the area's 300,000 poverty-stricken Arabs in four months. It may bring some headaches.

Since capturing the 28 by 6-mile area from the Egyptians, the Israelis have set up Arab municipal councils under a military governor, and instituted

tary governor, and instituted their own currency, postal and rail systems.

Israeli authorities in Tel Aviv reported there were no disturb-ances in the Gaza Strip Monday. But officials said the Arab pop-ulation appeared nervous. They did not rule out the possibility of trouble from hostile agitators when the withdrawal gets under



Boxes Indicate where Israelis will withdraw military forces. To be evacuated are the disputed Gaza Strip and the area around the mouth of the Gulf of Aqaba. Israel said it expected UN forces would take over in Gaza. The Strait of Tiran, Israel said, should be kept open to ships of all nations.
