The tragedy of Coar Boris was first written in movel form by Pushkin, "the father of Russian literature," and later adapted to music by Moussongaky. A shorter arrangement by Russian composer Niholai Rimsky-Korsakov is generally offered in favor of the original Moussorgsky version.

The plot of "Boris Godunov" seems to imitate Shakespear's "Macbeth." The opera centers around the mad Czar Boris of Russia, and is partly historical.

The lecture is one of the series features of the Second Annual Institute on Asia, sponsored by the Social Science Division of the College of Science and Arts.

Professor Beardsley is an austhority on Far Eastern and Central Asian archaeology and anthropology. He has done research work in Japan, and has compiled hibliographies and articles on Far Eastern anthropology.

Interestingly, Germany has a wide range of frequencies within itself In Hamburg, northern Germany, 52.7 percent of the children wrote stories in which Michael told the truth. In Karlsruhe, central Germany, the percent dropped to 38.9. And in Munich, southern Ger-many, the sample was 35.2 per-

most two-thirds of the Munich children did not do so. Surprisingly, the Mexico City studies registered 37.2 percent of truthfulness in "The Lost Meat" story. It has been pointed out that for 400 years, Mexicans have lived under a strict Span-ish authoritarian culture.

Union Cleanup Plan Still Not Undertaken

Union labor's corruption cleanup seems to have fissled a the Summer's hot weather, although AFI CiO leaders promise to pick it up again in a month or so.

The avowed cleanup keved to disclosures of the Senate Rackets Investigating Committee, was kicked off with Teamsters boss Dave Bock's quick ouster three months

ago as a federation officer. Little has happened since then.
The federation's ethical practices committee launched probes of the Teamsters Union itself and the Bakery Workers Union, based on charges they were corruptly dominated. But although initial hearings were held, others planned later were canceled to await action within the

Nor has the AFI Clo yet followed up another Senate committee's charges that Maurice Hutcheson, president of the big Carpenters Union and an AFI CIO vice-president. financed highway project. Like Beck, Hutcheson invoked the Fifth Amendment.

Nowhere among the labor organizations does there appear a sense of urgency in cleaning out the situations revealed this Spring and early Summer

At Bayes, chairman of the AFI CIO othical practices group, has been vacationing in the Wisconsin woods. The committee's counsel, Arthur Goldberg, has been lecturing in Europe on American labor

Means's call on other Teamster leaders some weeks ago to fire Beck "forthwith" as president of the nation's largest labor union has lain dormant. Beck has announced he will

not seek another term as president.



Insect Villains Foiled Again!

A spray mixture of malathion and tDTT will help to control rose chafters which are atlacking flowers in steadile numbers this year, reports Julius Hofman, MSU entomologist.

For flowers, Hoffman recommends two treapeoins of malathion emulsifiable concentrate and two level tablesposus of IMT 30 per cent wettable powder in one gailon of water Spray all leaf surfaces, both usper and under, thoroughly to get good control. Complete commends to critically impossible since adult chafter beetles fly in from surrounding areas Spray should be applied about once a week. The adult rose chafter will feed on the surface of almost any plant. The beetle has an overall lan color with a thin black stripe down the center of the back.
