# Placement Bureau-An MSU Specialty

Job placement is a serious business, and the Placement Bureau takes its job seriously.

Handling more than 300 interviews per day, the 15 mem ber staff manages to prepare an information sheet and " assemble a complete folder on every student interviewing a convenience both to the company representative and

Director Jack Breslin and his staff conduct two salary surveys each year and supply students base salary figures frem the information.

For the last nine years Placement Bureau has sponsored Career Carnival, an informal information service in which students meet company representatives to discuss employ ment opportunities and qualifications, or just to obtain

This project in itself deserves praise not only for the opportanity it affords students, but the fact that after nine years, it is still unique in the nation.

No other school has a similar event operating on such a large scale or covering such a wide range of employment opportunities, though many

are now considering the idea. The Placement Bureau ar rangement is itself a virtual rarity. In all the Big 10, only

MSU and Furdue have a centrally operating placement service. Formalized in 1943 by

Dean Tom King, who was head of Police Administration at that time, Placement Bureau was the crystalizaoperation considered more efficient

Formerly all placement was handled on a depart-

mental basis. This system made it necessary for a large company, interested, say, in engineers, accountants and secretaries, to write separate letters to respective departments, arrange separate interviewing schedules, and send representatives on different days. This was a costly process

through one organization, all records filed in one place, and the expected efficiency became a reality.

The administration regards Placement as the marketings division of the university, not so much for handing the student a job, or handing an employer an employe, but for making possible a contact between employer and student.

Co-operation between Placement Bureau and the administration throughout almost 15 years has enabled Placement to solve most of its problems. Its one big headache is space. There are only eight interview rooms available in. Morrill Hall

- But even this problem will soon be solved. By Dec. 15. according to King. Placement Bureau should be settled in its new quarters in the Student Services Building.

erating from a virtual mecca of placement centers. Breslin is confident this will be the finest placement center in the country

It will be equipped to handle 300 to 400 interviews per - day and a student body of 35,000. There will be a waiting lounge with ceiling loudspeakers, telephone equipped interview rooms, a library and shower stalls for company per-

Piacement Bureau already assists 90 percent of the stuinterviewing in obtaining robs a tremendous record It finds jobs for approximately 350 alumni each year, and gives vocational counseling at the student's request.

Such an effort by the Piacement Bureau should not go unnoticed. And perhaps the best way to show appreciation for this service is to utilize it.







# **Menderes Opponents Call Foul in Election**

ISTANBUL (47) — Opponents of Fremier Adnan Menderes cried foul Monday night after the thumping victory of his Dem-ocrat Party in Turkey's National

election.

The unofficial but final count showed the Democrats won 432 seats of the new 610-seat Parlia-ment in the voting Sunday, outdrawing their opponents in 47 of

drawing their opponents in 47 of nation's 67, provinces.

Menderes' leading rixal, expresident Ismet Inonu of the People's Republican Party, told a news conference the Republicans are lodging official complaints in each of the 47 provinces they lost

Inonu, 73, said the Democrats used police to interfere with voting, announced their victories over the state radio while voting was still going on and packed

was still going on and packed registration lists. "Under these conditions," I wonder which party really won and which really lost," Inonu

Registers Complaint by Telegram He said he had made these me said he had made these complaints in a telegram to Menderes, but was entering no official protest himself—leaving this instead to party organizations in the provinces.

— Despite Menderes' yietory,

some Republicans consoled them-selves with the fact they had cut solidly into the huge ma-jority he has enjoyed in Parlia-ment since 1954.

ment since 1954.

'The Republicans won 170 seats, according to the final count, with the Freedom and Nation Parties getting four seats each Three years ago Menderes won all but 38 seats in the national assembly.

The government itself showed no sign of worry at Republican complaints and prepared for the opening of the new assembly Nov. 1


