Council Discloses Academic Findings

EDITOR'S NOTE: The following is the second and final in a pair of articles investigating on a general-ized basis the academic quality of students at MSU. Information for this series is based in part on the text of a paper delivered by Dr. Thomas H. Hamilton, vice president for academic affairs, to the MSU Men's Club on October 1, 1957.

The preceding article considered the caliber of student admitted to the university. This one will deal primarily with his academic performance once he has been admitted. Approximately 25 percent of the students and MSU do not graduate because of academic difficulties, ac-Approximately 25 percent of the students admitted to

cording to findings by the Academic Council's Faculty Committee on Instruction, Curriculum, and Research.

In breaking this figure down, it was found that among students entering as freshmen about 21 percent leave the university for academic reasons before completing Basic College.

(This figure is based on a study done two years ago. The percentage of failures may be higher now due to recent changes within the Basic College, which will be discussed later.)

A further estimate by the faculty committee was that approximately five percent of the students at the junior and senior level left because of academic causes.

A surprising point is that the students admitted by examination procedure did not compose a substantial number of the "academic casualties." Though these persons had to overcome previous deficiencies in preparation and were required to meet specific requirements in grade standing, ey seemed to do reasonably well academically. Perhaps, this was due to their being put on guard, so that their motivation was higher than others.
