

Allies Press For U. S. View

Lodge to Disclose Algerian Policy

UNITED NATIONS, N.Y., (UPI)—The United States was under fire and elections must precede any talks.

A spokesman for the rebel African and European allies Sunday told the Assembly to take a stand for or against Algerian-French negotiations on freedom for Algeria.

An American source told a reporter the position would be disclosed in a speech by U.S. Delegate Henry Cabot Lodge in the U.N. General Assembly's Political Committee, probably this week. He added nothing would be said about it until then.

African and Asian delegations were working on a resolution whereby the Assembly would call on France to negotiate with Algerian Nationalists for settlement of the three-year-old rebellion in Algeria.

Moroccan King Mohammed V and Tunisian President Habib Bourguiba have offered to help in such negotiations to be based on sovereignty for Algeria and safeguards for French interests. But French Foreign Minister Christian Pineau told the U.N. committee in opening Algerian debate Wednesday that a cease-

"We are all anxious to hear the U.S. position," this source said. "Everybody has been asking the United States about it for the last month."

The matter was important because Syrian delegate Farid Zeineddin told the committee Saturday the U.S. stand on any resolution has its persuasive effects.

This has been especially true among the 20 Latin American delegations. A two-thirds vote in the 82-nation Assembly would be needed to adopt a resolution on Algeria.

An Asian diplomat expressed belief the United States would abstain from voting on any decisive Algerian resolution.





The Spartans will seek to avenge last year's 81-79 overtime setback at the hands of Butler.

The game will be replaced to night at 7:30 on the practice field and the winner will be the fraternity champion.
