# State News Pleas For The Homeless

SOMEWHERE TOWARD THE END of the year and the early part of the new, there is always an avalanche of writing in the press about the Most Outstanding This and That of the Year. We don't intend to join them. Allow us

to drink our toast rather to the unfortunate, the forgotten.

We newspapermen usually turn our sticks of space into celebrating someone or something—Michigan State's prettiest coeds, the BMOC's, the professors' new books, the ecture-concert hit. We run after significance, however short-lived it may be.

We want, even if briefly, to drink to the eternal thread that runs through our lives-to the homeless ones, the clothesless, the frustrated, the disappointed.

Yes, to the unfortunates. This is to the 3,000 homeless persons in Panama City—3,000 who have tried to build something of their own, a small business, a project, a family—only to have the faulty and unfinished structure go up

THESE PEOPLE ARE now the unconfident, whose days are lived tremblingly in the mirrors of others. These are the desperate. To those who have borne-as it seems to them-more than the mortal fibre can bear. To those who feel themselves teetering on the thin line that sometimes separates the still lucid world from the world of complete

Yes, this is to the 3,000 persons of Panama City-left homeless, victims of a fire whose flames and smoke will remain in their hearts and lungs forever.

To those who awake suddenly in the clutch of a nightmare terror. Yes, and to those for whom day and night together are nightmare, and who think fitfully of extinguishing the light altogether, in the frantic illusory hope

This is all to the homeless l'anamanians. Three-thousand people living in a baseball stadium—no clothes, no posses-

This too, is for the children. To all the unsure ones, stumbling and floundering as they try to make some sense, out of a world not of their making.

WE APPLAUD THOSE on our campus who feel the pain of these people. To those who have coordinated the clothes drive, to those that have donated and to those that will

We can't build homes for them, nor can we rid their hearts of anger and hate, of loneliness and rejection, of despair and frustration. The clotheless are not fastidiousthey'll wear shirts without button-down collars, pants and skirts without buckles, sweaters other than crewnecks, hats that are wrinkled and hose that have holes. This we can

To the 3,000 homeless we say: Despite the myth that it is the meek and the childlike who will inherit the earth, we don't think you will. We think it is the ruthless, the single-minded, the selfish, the unimaginative who will in-

But we must add that we are not sure, when the earth has been in the keeping of the successful, whether there will be much of it left to inherit.
