Suggestions Offered For L-C Problems

FOR THE FIRST TIME in the 1957-58 school year, a Lecture-Concert Series attraction has filled the University Aud. When Mantovani and company performed Tuesday night, even the Fairchild facilities were unable to accommodate the overflow in student attendance.

From our point of view, a distribution problem does

exist when announcement of the 8 a.m. ticket exchange Friday caused a large group of upperclassmen to form a 6 a.m. line at the Union Ticket Office—a line which had exhausted the available ducats by 10 a.m., two hours after distribution started.

The reason for the phenomenal upswing in student L-C Friday came as no great surprise to persons close to the ticket attendance records. The upperclassmen, from past experience (Mantovani was here two years ago). knew enough to play the early birds. But for freshmen (the most common victims of the

"sorry, no tickets left" reply) and some naive sophomores, the ticket distribution seemed to be a clear case of incompetent planning on the part of the booking manager. Why, these individuals demanded to know, was Manto-

vani not scheduled for two night, as was the poorly-at-tended Canadian Ballet earlier in the year? Why, they asked, had the L-C director not had the foresight to make proper booking arrangements for such a popular performgroup as Mantovani and company when it was appar ent that the ballet held nowhere the same student appeal.

Why, for that matter, did the Lecture-Concert Series continue to book performances which suffered miserable attendance showings because they were of interest to only a very limited minority of the student body? Why, they asked, should the Bach Aria Group and Leonard Rose be expected to fill the Aud when it seems perfectly obvious that their audience is composed almost solely of music department students and faculty, plus season ticket pa-

WHILE WE CANNOT SPEAK for Dr. Wilson Paul, director of the Lecture-Concert Series, perhaps we can present his expressed views on these questions with some suggestions of our own.

One of the prime concerns of Dr. Paul in booking L-C .Series must be expenses. At our estimate, Mantovani and company cost the Series \$6,000 for the one-night standtwo nights would have been \$12,000. Certainly, the director must be judicious with the L-C money. Still, costs for the Canadian Ballet would not have been inexpensive for their two-night stand. Apparently other considerations enter into LeC policy of which we are not aware.

Dr. Paul has held in the past that the purpose of the L-C Series is to educate and to entertain. Perhaps the greatest single reason for attendance dropoff since Dean Stanley Crowe retired as director of the L-C Series has been the noticeable emphasis on the education factor—we cite the Each Aria Group as evidence of this.

The presence of culture in the L-C Series is, in itself,

testamment hav to as a filled house, it would seem wiser to combine the chiral and entertainment factors so as to have someone to educate in attendance

As an off-hand example, we feel that this end would be fulfilled if Dr. Paul kept his eyes open for such combinations as the late # zim l'inza (the great Metropolitan Opera voice would certainly have qualified culturally) when he was touring with Rodgers and Hammerstein's "South Pacific" (the entertainment factor).

An agreement should be made with the Music-Concert Series to handle the limited audience "highbrow" numbers in Fairchild, Certain changes would be called for in both s, but the need for a more realistic approach to the problem makes this type of action essential.


