### **Scientists Study Cellular Mutation**

WHEN SCIENCE KNOWS why cancer cells vary from rmal cells, finding a cure for the nation's number two sease may be comparatively simple.

Just as the fact that weeds have broader leaves than cass made it possible to develop weed killers, differences etween cancerous and normal cells may lead to a cancer

Even a drug that is poisonous to both normal and canerous cells could be helpful if the tumor's greater appetite aused it to gorge itself on the drug and die before healthy ue is damaged. Such drugs are now being tested.

Although science does not know what causes malignant elis to be as they are, it does know the chemicals within e cell that are most likely responsible.

These chemicals-nucleic acids-are a special concern of James Fairley, assistant professor of chemistry.

Found in all cells, nucleic acids are often called "mole ales of life" because they control or direct reproduction

As do many cancer researchers, Dr. Fairley maintains at cancer may result, when cells do not build up tmetabo e) nucleic acids in the normal manner. Adding to the redibility of this theory are indications that cancerous s contain larger amounts of nucleic acids than do nor-

More precise knowledge of how cells build nucleic acids, Fairley believes, may help to solve the cancer problem. gain this knowledge, he is attempting to determine various chemicals that go together to form nucleic Parts believed necessary are "labeled" by making

As cells use these materials, they can be "tracked" to if they are eventually embodied in nucleic acids. He already found two amino acids that go into pyrimidines, hich, in turn, are components of nucleic acid-(See CANCER, Page 6)

### U. S. Show Of Strength Apparent

#### Navy Terms Move 'Routine Exercise'

WASHINGTON (P) The United States is doubling the size of its amphibious marine force in the Mediter. ranean and sending more warships into the area in what appears to be a show of strength to help riot-torn Lebanon.

Lebanon.

The fleet movements, disclosed Wednesday might by the Navy, came a few hours after the State Department reported it is rushing small arms to Lebanon to help the pro-Western government light off motis threatening to overthrow it.

The Navy insisted its attion is not connected with the Lebanon risis but is a routine haval exercise in the central Mediterranean. But the Navy restated to disclose the location of the 3.600 Marines aboard. Historia in the area.

the 3,900 Marines aboard 11 ships in the area. Amout 1,800 of these Marines aboard six ships had been scheduled to return to the Unit-ed States after their replace-ment arrived but the Navy said they "will remain in the Medisterranean for the time being

# As part of the maneuvers, warships of the Mediterraneau Sixth Fleet will be leaving ports in the area "for the next several days," the Navy added.

The Marines already amphibious force are those of the first battalion of the 8th Regiment. They are being re-inforced by the Second Battalion of the second Regiment from the United States.

Announcement of the Sixi-Fleet movements came as the State Department applianded what it called "the courageous efforts" of President Camille Chamotin's government to re-store order in Lebanon despite five straight days of anti-West-courage of the Sixiern rioting

In disclosing the weapons shipment, a State Department spokesman stressed they were small items, such as ammunition, and tear gas. No tanks, planes or heavy equipment was involved, he said.

Nearly all authorities agreed that 'massive interference' by Egypt and Syria were to blame for the bloody rioting, as charge-ed by Lebanon's Foreign Mini-ter Charles Malik in Beirut Tuesday.

At least one small stream cutting through a moraine south of Owosso has had gold panned from its gravel. There is probably some trace of the metal in the bed of the Red Cedar River, but recent campus explorations have failed to turn up any.

plott, there is no longer any such thing as staking a claim in this A word of caution—it is illegal to hord gold, and it can only be sold, legally, to the United States government.






