Tunisia Charges French Troops Invade Territory

TUNIS (P)-Tunisia Wednes-

TUNIS 6Ph—Tunisia Wednesday complained that French troops and tanks have livaded Tunisian territory along the Alwerian frontier and refused to withdraw.

The secretary of state for foreign affairs, Eadok Mokkadem, delivered a sharp protest to the Brench ambassador.

A communique from the ministry of information said.

"On the morning of Nov. 5 French forces estimated at two regiments supported by 42 tanks penetrated Tunisian territory in the region of Bou Jabeur. Supported by mortar fire, these forces then moved north in the direction of Kalaar Senam. According to the latest information, they are still three kilometers (1.86 miles) inside Tunisian territory."

The village of Sidi Sakiet Yousef was bombed by French planer last Feb. 8, taking a toil of 78 killed and 84 wounded abcording to Tunisian figures.

Liquors Banned In College Town

was solidly opposed by East Lansing voters Tuesday and a prohibition chapter in the city charter was upheld by a lesser

Six of the city's seven precincts voted to stop the sale of houor-by-the-glass in the Marble district of East Lansing.

Five precincts voted to keep the \$7-year-old prohibition chapter in the charter.

Fate of the one liquor (Class C license) establishment, the Deer Head Inn, was sealed but it was not discussed Wednesday when Blanche Everts would have to close the doors to the here.

Even less definite is the fu-ture of the one tavern which has a beer and wine by-the-glass license (Gayest Bar) and the one retail beer and wine store (Tom's Market). But voters opposed liquor by-the-glass 3,407-2,198 and favor-ed the prohibition chapter 3,147-2,351. Only the seventh (MSU) pre-

cinct voted in favor of liquor by-the-glass, 260-214.

The MSU precinct favored the repeal proposal 270 to 194.

In one other precinct—number six in the Marble district—voters favored repeal 496-486 but that precinct opposed liquor by-the-glass 539-447.

WASHINGTON (P)-Dem ocrats battered down a final Republican bastion in the West and produced their biggest U. S. Senate gain in history from belated returns day's election.

day's election.

The 13-seat gain surpassed by one the previous Democratic record of 12 seats in 1932.

The dwindling trickle of ballots from the hinterlands merely enlarged the dimensions of the most spectacular Democratic political triumph since the New Deal heydays. Late results tightened an already strengthened Democratic control of both Senate and House and tossed more Republican governors out of office.

But to a question whether he thought the people Tuesday "chose left-wing government"—terms he used in campaign oratory — the President replied: "I don't know whether they did this thing deliberately.
