

WASHINGTON (A)-The U. S. Monday bluntly re-jected Soviet Premier Nikita Khrushchev's call for an end to four-power occupation of

A state department spokes-man said none of the four pow-ers can walk out on the occupa-tion agreement on its own. And he said the Western big three are prepared to fight if neces-sary to defend West Berlin's freedom.

State department press chief Lincoln White gave that U. S. reaction to statements by Khrus-chev at a Polish-Soviet friend-ship meeting in Moscow.

In response to newsmen's in-quiries, White said: The "U.S. has always main-tained the position that the four powers are in Berlin as a result of the total surrender of the

Nazi regime
"No one of the four powers
can divest itself of its responsibilities and obligations unilat-

erally.
"The U. S. certainly has no intention of so doing."
