Liberal party and a powerful influence since the Edwardian Reformers, died Tuesday, He was 93.

The death of Herbert Louis Samuel left Sir Winston of the famous Liberal government of Sir Henry Campbell which in 1906 laid the foundation for the modern welfare state.

The son of a wealthy Jewish Samuel was always a power in British politics but never a top leader. Despite his recognized ability, Lord Samuel, never a showman, was overshadowed by the spectacular
