NEW YORK M - Pierre Salinger, President Kennedy's press be thught. secretary, said Wednesday, "I think the news management story

is a greatly overworked one." He had been asked on a taped CBS Television program, "Self Portrait," whether he consciously, for the President, managed news as an instrument of national policy.

Criticism of the Kennedy administration's information policies was heightened last Oct. 30 when Arthur Sylvester, Assistant Secretary of Defense for Public Affairs, told newsmen that the Pentagon controlled news as a weapon during the Cuban crisis.

On the television program, Salinger said "I think I see my job, and the President sees my job, as getting out the information to the press, all the information we can within the limits of national security.".

Salinger added that "I've always held to the theory that the news should go out as it happens, and in most cases that's on a nuclear test ban. are, as I say, matters of na-rional security, that you duf's just publicize."

MOSCOW - Premier Khrushchev has warned that any attack on Cuba would mean nuclear war. The Russian leader, in a major radio and television address, said Russia did not take its missiles and bombers out of Cuba only to leave the island, as he put it, to the "imperialist sharks."

Khrushchev, made no mention of the 17-thousand Russian troops still in Cuba - several thousand of whom Moscow has pledged to take home soon. But he again said President Kennedy had made a pledge not to invade Cuba...a pledge Washington has denied.

On other subjects Khrushchev said -- Russia would aid any Communist nation under attack -- said there can be no peace until a German peace treaty is signed, but seemed to indicate he is ready to accept continued presence of allied forces in West Berlin -- and stated that Russia would make no more concessions



Piano Team Excells Before Capacity Crowd

Pierre Luboshutz and his wife, Genia Nemenoff, presented an unforgettable duo-plano recital in the Music A ditorium

The huge audience spilled over into the orchestra pit and ear hall. Despite its size, the audience was respectfully attentive and tremendously enthusiastic.

After performing together for a quarter of a century, the couple has refined the art of duo-planism to sheer wizardy. His style of playing is calm and controlled; hers more animated and graceful.

And yet their rapport is such that one cannot say at a particular moment, "This is Luboshutz" or "Now Nemenoff

Their finesse and musicianship were displayed to best advantage in the Romantic pieces on the program; the sweetly murmuring "Prelude" of Franck, Debussy's whimsical "Lindaraja" -- performed to commemorate his centenary -, and especially in Rachmanioff's "Second Suite for Two Planos," which brilliantly pays homage to Chopin.

The Classical period was represented by Mozart's "Concerto in E flat," with accompaniment by a chamber orchestra. conducted by Hans Lampl professor of music. The young players responded well to the stylistic challenge, but the oncerto is not first-rate Mozart.

The remaining work on the program was the "Concerto in A Minor," as arranged by Bach for organ, and re-arranged y Mr. Luboshutz for two planos.

This is admirable Baroque music, effective indeed with the octave doublings by which organ registration is suggested. But it lacks the intimacy of music originally conceived for this particular medium.

Music-lovers in the university and community will look forward eagerly to the next concert by Luboshutz and Nemenwhich should be given in a larger auditorium in order


