Washoe is a chimp who talks — with her hands. And you can meet her for the first time on television on "The First Signs Of Washoe" on NOVA this Sunday night at 7:30 p.m. on Channel 23.

Washoe has a vocabulary of over 150 words and she uses it with a frankness that might not make a sailor blush, but she certainly does communicate! She'll let you know just exactly what she thinks about something — or you.

Washoe was "brought up" by Prof. Allen Gardner and Dr. Trixie Gardner in their home. The Gardners taught Washoe American Sign Language, the language of the deaf. Not only has Washoe turned out to be an amazingly successful scientific experiment — but it turns out she has some very "human" characteristics.

Recently, Washoe was introduced to monkeys and given the symbol "monkey." Washoe understood and incorporated "monkey" into her vocabulary. One day however her teacher checking her progress, pointed to a monkey and asked Washoe, "What is that?" Washoe immediately made the symbols for "dirty monkey." He pointed to another monkey and asked her, "What is that?" And Washoe signed simply "monkey." But, back to the first monkey — a rhesus monkey she didn't like — and Washoe again signed "dirty monkey." Washoe had been taught the word "Dirty," but she had been taught that it only described spoiled objects or feces. This new "application" of the word came right out of Washoe's own



head!
"The First Signs of Washoe" episode of the NOVA sciences series on the PBS network has won the American Psychological Foundation's Grand Prix Award for 1974.

The APF's Grand Prix Award was presented to the top winner from five competing categories of Media Award winners. "The First Signs of Washoe" had already won the APF's National Media

Award in the television/film category. The Grand Prix Award signifies "the single outstanding communications effort about psychology in 1974."

Simon Campbell - Jones, writer and producer of the program, accepted the Award at a ceremony

in New Orleans on August 31st.


"The First Signs of Washoe" is the story of Washoe the chimpanzee who was taught American Sign Language by psychologists Allen and Trixie Gardner. Washoe

Question: Why is it some movies are on over and over — and believe me I'm not griping. If it's a show I like, I like to see it several times. What I am griping about is that some movies I'd like to see don't come back. A couple of years ago, when my set was out for repairs they televised "Interlude" with Oskar Werner. I've written the station three times to request that it be shown again. They never replied... though I presume it's right there in

their storeroom. What can be done about this?

Answer: The whole problem of airing films is tremendously complicated. You can't just dip into a bin and air a film on request, alas. Stations book their movies from distributors who have strict control over the number of permissible showings. And usually what a station contracts for is a "package." That is a selection of films compiled by the distributor. As to the Werner film, we believe it was shown as a network special and has not been released yet to local stations.



is the first animal to master the rudiments of language and she has smashed the belief that language is unique to man. Much of the film data was actually recorded by the Gamblers over the years of their experiment with the chimp.

The NOVA series is a presentation of WGBH - Boston. Executive Producer is Michael Ambrosino. NOVA is funded by grants from Carnegie Corporation of New York, Corporation for Public Broadcasting, National Science Foundation, and Polariod Corporation. NOVA is produced with the advice and cooperation of the American Association for the Advancement of Science.

AND Takes a Trip Through the Bureacracy

"The trouble with Washington, D.C.'s 19 million tourists is that they spend most of their time standing in a line and then leave the place without being any smarter about it than when they came."

That's the impression of CBS News producer Andrew Rooney, whose CBS News Special "Mr. Rooney Goes to Washington" will be broadcast Sunday, Jan. 26 (9:30 - 10:30 PM, EST) on the CBS Television Network.

Rooney recently spent two months as a somewhat unorthodox tourist in the nation's capitol, putting this broadcast together. He won't vouch for how much "smarter" his months in Washington made him. But he did learn a lot about Government bureaucracy.

"We kept trying to find out exactly why it is our Government has grown so big and why there are so many bureaus in bureaucracy," Rooney says. "One of the reasons seems to be that almost every committee, every agency or every department is established by law. But there's never anything in that

law about putting the agency out of business when its job is done. Once established, a Government agency, like a Government job, is practically immortal.

"If a committee or agency has a name that makes it sound out of date, it doesn't go out of business. It just changes its name."

Rooney has some advice for tourists who want to learn more about their Government. He suggests spending time at Congressional committee sessions that are open to the public and less time hanging around the Washington Monument.

Rooney, who dropped in on about 30 committees, says, "You often pick up interesting bits of information."

Visiting the House of Representatives gallery (without a camera), Rooney observed a "little argument" between Republican Congressman James Cleveland of New Hampshire and Pierre du Pont of Delaware. Rep. Cleveland was trying to get Federal assistance money for people in a ski area because it hadn't snowed much.

Rep. du Pont was against it.

Rooney later asked Rep. Cleveland, "Is no snow a natural disaster?" Cleveland thought so. Rep. du Pont thought that if no snow in New Hampshire was qualification enough for Federal assistance, then rain in Rehoboth Beach, Del., a summer tourist place, might similarly qualify the people in that area who sold bikinis.

Even after two months of solid, if unique, Washington study, Rooney says, "It's hard to find out anything about anything. People hide things there's no reason for them to hide.

"It's very apparent that we all ought to know more about what's going on in Washington. The people who think everything is wrong down there are as far from the truth as the people who don't think anything is wrong. It's not being run by evil people, it's being run by people like you and me. And you know how we have to be watched..."

News & Notes from Here & There

Joseph Wambaugh, the Los Angeles policeman who took half a year to write his second novel, then tried returning to the force... found it just didn't work. As the author of two best-sellers, "The New Centurions" and "The Blue Knight," he found he had acquired a celebrity status that got in his way. So reluctantly he resigned for

good and turned his attention to writing and overseeing his two highly successful series, "Police Story" and "Police Woman" produced by Columbia Pictures Television for NBC.

Just as well he did resign, too. For if his famous reputation got in his way while his face was still unknown, imagine the attention he

would attract now that he has debuted also as an actor.

It was his first try at acting; playing an undercover cop. His wife, the first critic he sought an opinion from, cheered him greatly when she said of his performance, "You looked like a real sneak."
