

PROFILE OF THE WEEK:

Diana Rigg

It seems inevitable that the American television public, which knows Diana Rigg principally as the blithe secret agent, Emma Peel in "The Avengers," will wonder how she got herself into the sensitive and serious drama special set in a convent, "In This House of Brede," airing Thursday night (February 27 at 9:00 p.m. on CBS.)

Actually, this means coming full circle in her career. For her countrymen in England were astonished that Miss Rigg, a classical actress with a good track for Shakespearean and Shavian roles, took on the spy spoof in the first place. But as she herself has said, "It was fun in its way. And good, too, in its way. Whenever I do catch an episode re-running I'm glad to say I'm not ashamed of it." The judo skills needed? "Oh, I couldn't never have done that if hadn't been carefully choreographed."

She is less proud of her short - lived,

Hollywood - produced seris, "Diana."

Toward the end she was beginning to huddle with the writers in developing situations suitable for an English divorcee living in New York . . . but by then it was too late. The series was axed. And Diana went back to England and several notable roles: as Heloise in "Heloise and Abelard," and more recently "Major Barbara."

She was born in England, but was taken as an infant, to live in India where her father worked as an engineer. At eight she was shipped home to England and boarding school, the memory of which still gives her the shudders. But on holidays her grandparents took her to the theater and as she sayd, "From the very first, I loved Shakespeare." When she played Titania in a school production of "A Midsummer Night's Dream," she set her goals. Be good enough to join the Old Vic. She was and she did.




