



Game Show Aide Jane Nelson Has No Acting Aspirations

Jane Nelson, tall, slender and brunette, is the on-camera emcee's aide on three current game shows, "Dealer's Choice," "Diamond Head" and "Treasure Hunt." If you'll settle for a short answer, Jane will tell you, "I really am lucky." Don't settle for it. She's being too modest. She is a former Miss United States, who also won honors in three other major beauty pageants: she was first runner up for "Miss U.S.A." (in the pre-"Miss Universe" competition at Miami), "Miss Swimsuit" at a "Miss America" pageant in Atlantic City.

"That was when I was in high school, back home (in Alamogordo, New Mexico)." Her parents (her father is the high school superintendent, her mother is a teacher) thought it sounded like a good idea for Jane's scholarship fund, so why not? Jane, a delightful young woman with good sense, and a sly good humor says: "From that I learned what they are looking for in all the contests. They want girls who are not sexy. Pretty, but not too pretty. All-American girls but not giggly; toned down, really toned down."


Jane goes on, "That got me a summer job at 'Six Flags Over Texas' which was very good for me. I sang and danced and played the guitar and my best

instrument, the kettle drums."

But don't misunderstand. She didn't (and still doesn't) want to be an actress. She had a goal at the time, since fulfilled and surpassed. To be a member of a symphony orchestra. "I played with the Los Angeles Community Orchestra for two years between other jobs after I got out of college. As what? Percussionist, the tympani."

But meanwhile, back to the winning streak with beauty contests (and later on, jobs). Every time Jane sought out an opportunity it paid off. But be it noted, she has always taken the first steps toward her "luck." She was on holiday from college "near home" when she and her mother drove to El Paso for a shopping spree. "There were 'Miss America' applications at a gas station so mother and I laughed and said, 'Why not?' and I entered." And became "Miss New Mexico," and got to take the whole family (her parents, one sister and two brothers) along to Atlantic City to meet Bert Parks. "It nearly drove Dad crazy! It was our first trip East and it gave mother and I a great chance to go shopping in New York." Then Jane won another nice wardrobe, \$1,000 toward the scholarship fund and a car.

"I planned to re-locate in Chicago after college but I landed there in a snowstorm. It seared me and I headed back for the Southwest; Los Angeles." Within days she was hired for an auto commercial, then a big toothpaste commercial. "I had been there a year when Cuck Barris put out a cattle call for girls for 'The Dating Game' to give out the bicycles and the typewriters and show a lot of teeth." Jane got the job. "Then a nice thing happened. I was hired for 'Treasure Hunt' with Geoff Edwards; it's a stylish show. I found I liked game shows so when another cattle call went out for 'Dealer's Choice' I wanted it. For the first time I was nervous." Wisely, Jane role-played when she picked her audition-outfit. "I wore a tight sweater and an old skirt now much shorter than I would wear on the street . . . for a Las Vegas mood. And it worked. The same company (both are Columbia Pictures Television features) also does 'Diamond Head,' and once a month we all go to Hawaii." Any new goals? "Yes. I want to be in production." And with her knack for helping her "luck," count on her to be wearing a producer's hat. Right?

PROFILE OF THE WEEK: James Earl Jones

When James Earl Jones co-starred as big, dimwitted Lenny in the recent Broadway revival of "Of Mice and Men," long-time critic Jack O'Brian was moved to say that not only was Jones' the best Lenny of all time, "He is one of the three or four greatest actors I have seen in my lifetime."

It is one of television's virtues that it can — and occasionally does — capture a great theatrical performance on film. And it did with the taping several years ago of what is probably Jones' greatest role to date, the title role in a New York Shakespeare Festival production of "King Lear."

No, he said, thoughtfully in an interview at the time, it seems to bother no one to have a Black man in the role. "And for me it is a privilege to play this role so young, at 42 instead of having to wait 20 years."

Now, as the concluding offering of the current

"Theater in America" series, PBS stations this week will show Jones' "King Lear" again. (Wednesday is the night in many cities, but check local schedules.)

Jones says with dignity that the director, El Sherin, prepared him for the role by saying, "You have proven you can speak with clarity, now forget it. Go for the guy."

Amazingly, there was a time when Jones could not speak with clarity. He will not say he was unhappy as a child . . . just that he and the strict grandmother who brought him up were very different types and he was handicapped by severe stuttering until the encouragement of a high school teacher eased him out of it.

He is a graduate of the University of Michigan and had planned a career as an Army officer when he decided to give acting "a two year try." He has since been nominated for an Oscar.

The Mississippi River, Past And Present, The Locale of Specials

The good ole Mississippi River, — then and now — is the locale of two television specials this week. For the old days, ABC brings on (Tuesday, March 25 at 8:30 p.m.) 90 minutes' of a new musical version of the Mark Twain classic, "Huckleberry Finn," in which Roy Clark sings a new river song, called, what else? — "Mississippi. 20-year old Ron Howard stars as the somewhat younger freckle-faced Huck and his whole family appears in supporting roles (father Rance, mother Jean and younger brother Clint).

"Runaway Barge" (Monday night, March 24 at 8:00) is NBC's contemporary Mississippi entry. It is a 90-minute movie called "Runaway Barge" as of Monday . . . but is also a potential series for next fall if it catches favor with viewers and sponsors. Tim Matheson, Bo Hopkins and Jim Davis are the boatmen; James Farentino is an undercover cop. "Runaway

Barge" was filmed on location, or rather locations. The plot moves from state to state along the river and so did the production.

Competing with "Runaway Barge" commencing at 9:00 p.m. is the week's big, bubbling variety special starring Mitzi Gaynor on CBS. Her official guests are Michael Landon and Jack Albertson . . . but approximately 98 other well-known performers make cameo appearances in a song and dance number from which the entire special takes its title: "Mitzi

and a Hundred Guys." How does any production ante up a payroll for such talent? It doesn't. The chorus guys appear for free and Mitzi makes a donation to a worthy charity in their honor. (The Motion Picture and Television Relief Fund is the beneficiary.) Among the charity chorus members: Steve Allen, Edward Asner, Milton Berle, Bill Bixby, Mike Connors, Clifton Davis, James Farentino (competing with his NBC movie), Bob Hope, Rock Hudson, Jack Lemmon and Telly Savalas.
