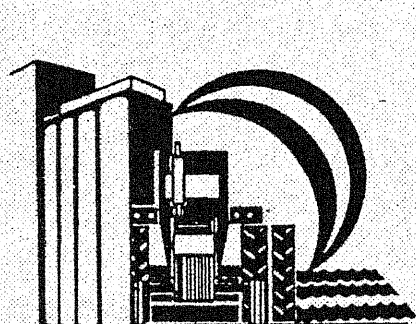

## Messiah presentation Sunday in Pigeon by Community Chorus

The Community Chorus will present Handel's "Messiah" in concert this Sunday, Dec. 11 at 2:30 p.m. at the Laker Auditorium, Pigeon.

Robert Story of Linwood will return as director of the 40-voice chorus, and Pam Dubey will be the accompanist.

Soprano soloist will be Alissa Walters, Alto soloist will be Cindy Anderson, and the Tenor soloist will be Kelly Ford, and all will be accompanied by Mitzi Chaffee, all from Central Michigan University. Bass soloist will be Verne Frede of Bay City, accompanied by Bryant Brewer.

The "Messiah" is writ-

ten in three parts. Part I begins with Jesus' coming and birth and ends with a foreshadow of what is to come. Part II details Christ's crucifixion and the famous Hallelujah Chorus celebrates the kingship of Christ.

Part III tells of the benefits of Christ's sacrifice—reconciliation, redemption and victory over death.

The chorus, shown here in practice, will present selections from each section of the "Messiah." And scripture readings between selections will provide continuity.

Admission is free, and a free will offering will be taken.

Jim Licht named Michigan's top farmer

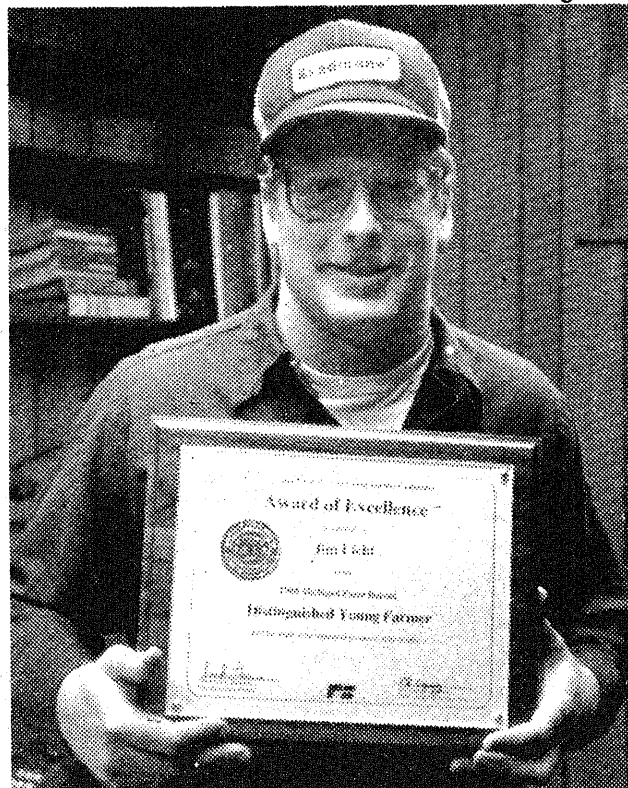

## Jim Licht is tops!

among representatives sent by each county's Farm Bureau chapter, and on the basis of answers given on a questionnaire before the annual meeting, four finalists were interviewed.

Licht said the judges based their decision on the finalists' farming activities, leadership activities, and the final interview.

"I didn't expect to be chosen as Outstanding Young Farmer. I thought it would be nice to be first runner-up, but when they called someone else's name, I thought I would be third or fourth. It was a total surprise."

**PRIZES:** For his win, Licht received a \$1,500 product certificate from Great Lakes Hybrids and an all-expense paid trip to the annual meeting of the American Farm Bureau in San Antonio, Texas, Jan. 7-12.

Licht and his wife Susan, and two children, Jeremy, 6, and Katie, 2, live on the family farm east of Pigeon on Maxwell Road. Although he owns 80 acres of farmland, he has nearly 400 acres under cultivation, growing beans, navy beans, soybeans, corn, wheat, oats, and hay.

**SECOND JOB:** And if farming wasn't enough work, he also puts in a full week's work as an inspector at Pigeon Manufacturing.

"To farm and work full-time, you have to manage your time well. And it takes a lot of patience from family members, because sometimes we don't see each other very often, especially in the spring."

Having part-time help dur-

ing busy times and the help of his father Edwin takes some of the pressure off Licht.

Why work such hours? "It started as a winter occupation. As farm prices started to drop, I thought it was in my best interest to find another source of income."

"It's mainly a way to get ahead. I believe it's important to reduce your debts, and by working an extra job, I'm trying to get my land paid off."

"It's a lot easier to making a living farming if your farm is debt-free."

**A BELIEVER:** Even though he's hedging his bets by working what amounts to two full-time jobs, Licht is optimistic about the future of farming.

"Lately, there's been some increase in prices, and some of the input costs have decreased. I think once we get out of the current economic conditions, farming will get better and more profitable."

**BENEFITS:** He feels that having the state's top Cooperative in Pigeon is a big plus for area farmers, in that more value-added products can be marketed through the Co-op -- such as the racehorse oats produced at the new plant in Elkton.

A 1976 graduate of Laker High, Licht was very active in the school's FFA chapter, serving as chapter president for two years, along with being chosen regional vice-president and president of the State FFA organization.

In the Huron County Farm Bureau, Licht has served as membership chairman, pol-

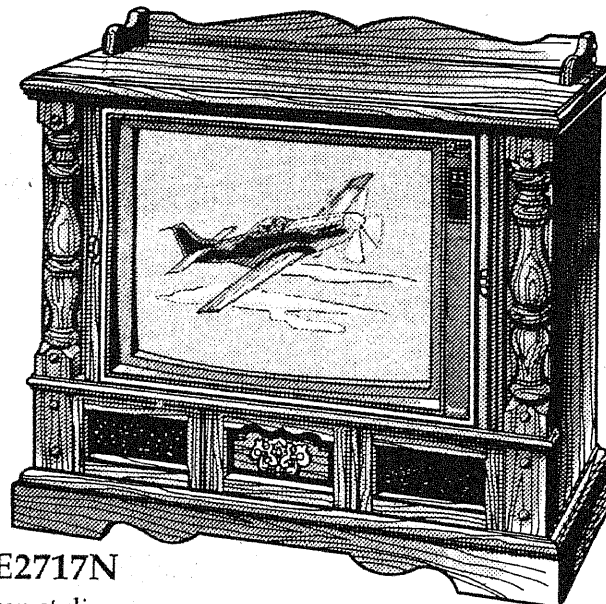

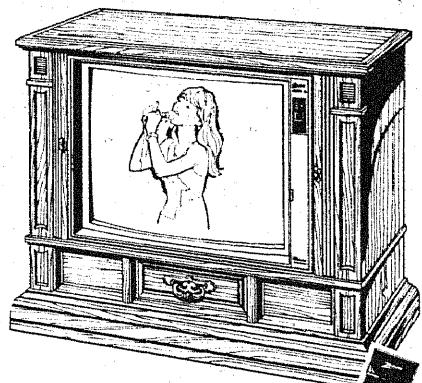

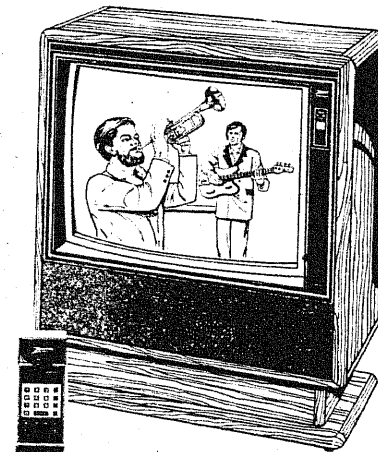

**Something To  
Think About**

It should be clearly understood that home care for the terminally ill, while a substitute in some cases for prolonged hospitalization, is NOT a substitute for a doctor's care. It is a complement to it. A patient treated at home by a visiting nurse will almost always remain simultaneously under the jurisdiction of their doctor. This means that from the start, the doctor must be agreeable to working with a patient who requests home care and must be willing to cooperate with home care professionals.

In the preliminary stage of home care, the visiting nurse enters the patient's home, often accompanied by a social worker or other health care professional. Together they make a total assessment of the domestic situation. Then they devise a plan for home care operation and send their proposal to the doctor. He or she may make suggestions, additions, or draw up a schedule of specific treatments. Then a final plan is drawn up and discussed by all.

## Woods & Waters

### Six o'clock buck

*The blood curdling rebel yell piercing the early morning air told the story, and at Dan's feet lay the dead 8-point.*

Dan had seen the 8-point buck 2 or 3 times during bow season. It would usually come out around 6 o'clock and feed in a hay field at the edge of the woods he was hunting. It ran with a herd of 5 does and another buck that called the woodlot home, and they had developed a unique system of "casing" the hay field before feeding time each evening. More than once, Dan had been caught looking the other way and warning snort from one of the does would send the bucks into evasive action.

His best chance during the first portion of the archery season had come late one evening. He had crawled from his blind toward a fence row to scan the field. Upon reaching the rusty wire, he came face to face with a doe who proceeded to pin him down with an icy stare. Dipping his head to escape the piercing eyes, Dan glanced over his shoulder into another set of eyes. However, this pair was framed by the graceful curve of ivory-colored antlers -- antlers large enough to make Dan's breath catch in his throat. It was a "Catch-22" situation and the deer won out. Crashing into the woods, they left behind a slightly-shaken hunter and a greatly pounding heart.

The big buck kept to the woods most of the time. On those few occasions when the wind blew from the direction of the woods, he would strut majestically down the middle of the field thrusting his sensitive nose forward warning him of impending dangers. As night fell on the 3rd evening of the firearm deer season, Dan huddled behind the fallen tree that served as his blind and watched his "6-o'clock" buck do exactly that.

Dan Crumm is a friend and neighbor who operates a small, blackpowder shop in Sebewaing. He is an ardent deer hunter and chooses to pursue his quarry with a bow or a flintlock rifle. During the past several years Dan has quietly taken the good-humored ribs of Randy Haley, another flintlock hunter from the area. Randy has already bagged 2

bucks with his antiquated firearm and, to make matters worse, this year had dropped a fine 5-pointer opening morning to make it 3 years in a row. Dan had yet to kill his first deer with a flintlock.

The friendly competition between Randy and Dan involves more than deer hunting. Throughout the summer shooting season, they vie with one another for top honors in the flintlock category. To make matters more intense Randy had snatched Dan's coveted mountain man hat at one of the shoots and placed it on the 50-yard range to be ridden full of holes by a group of more-than-willing-to-do-it accomplices.

Dan glanced down the field and estimated the distance between him and the buck was now down to 150 yards. Nervously, he checked the priming pan for the 3rd time. Still out of range, he thought to himself, but the brisk breeze blowing on his back told him he could not wait much longer or his tell-tale scent would reach the buck's searching nose.

When the distance closed to less than 100 yards, Dan shouldered the .54 caliber flintlock and placed the slightly-wavering sights on the buck's shoulder. The 90 grains of black powder caused the rifle to slam hard against his shoulder and the view of the buck was quickly obliterated by a pall of dense white smoke.

Dan's heart dropped when a clear picture finally came into focus. The buck had wheeled and was heading for the woods as if nothing had ever happened.

Dan is an excellent shot, and tried to convince himself that even at that distance, there was no way he could have missed the buck. But convinced or not, he could not find any blood and darkness was closing in

fast. Being on the midnight shift meant leaving the woods before he wanted to go, but when the next day's dawn peeked out of the western sky, Dan was back in the woods.

He had planned to start at the road and cross the road until he found something, or nothing, and he didn't like the last thought.

Two hours later perched exhaustedly on the stump, his hands scratched red

from numerous encounters with thorns and thickets, he spied a brown hump in the distance. It's either a large brown stone or my "6-o'clock" buck he thought to himself.

"The pressure is off," he thought aloud.

### Outdoor Report

A lucky 145 hunters were selected for the December elk hunt and the Thumb continued to be well represented. Richard Krohn of Elkhart, Gary and Kenneth Stockoski of Port Austin, Joel Stoick of Caro and John Farver and Barbara Dudek of Fairgrove will be participating in the December 6 opener and are already knee-deep in preparation for this "once in a lifetime" hunt.

With the 1988 firearm deer season finally over, DNR officials will be tabulating the results and issuing information in the near future. A couple of records are sure to be set. The first will be a record kill. Preliminary reports have indicated that the harvest should be up by several percentage points making it the largest on record. The 2nd record was good news for everyone. Only 8 hunters lost their lives during the 1988 hunt. While this may sound morbid to some, one must realize that with 800,000 hunters in the field it was something short of a miracle. Compare those figures to a Sunday morning drive and you will know what I mean.

Black powder hunters are getting ready for the muzzleloading season which begins this Friday. The 10-day hunt will give rifle hunters a chance to fill unused tags providing they hunt with a muzzle-loader of at least .44 caliber.

Perch fishermen along the shore and at the mouths of local rivers are landing some nice catches. The time period just before the first freeze is usually some of the best fishing but it's hard to get hunters to change their line of thinking so quickly.
