Steelhead numbers looking GOOD!

Award-winning concert available, program chairman of steelhead in area streams Michigan reports.

Fisheries biologists from the Michigan Department of Natural Resources (DNR) expect this year's migration to be as good or better than last year.

They base their optimistic predictions on the strength of fall spawning runs, quality of steelhead being planted in Great Lakes tributaries and favorable conditions for natural reproduction.

However, some said inthe past two years in the Great lakes could reduc the March 29 - Good Friday number of fish returning to spawn this spring.

East Michigan anglers be from mid-April to early should find good numbers May in East Michigan although warm weather could spur earlier runs.

Steelhead-rainbow trout that live in the Great Lakes - are doged fighters with tasty flesh. The fish, which average 5 to 12 pounds, return to spawn in the stream where they were planted or hatched.

Migrating steelhead normally will be found in the main flow of a river and are targets for waders, shore men and boaters.

The most popular bait for steelhead is a spawn bag, a creased steelhead harvests sack containing salmo eggs or the roe from a captured steelhead. The spawn sack should be bumped along the stream botom near rocks, stumps or other obstructions,
