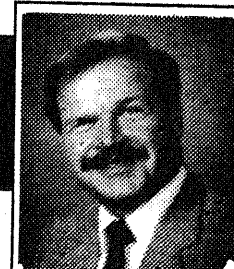
"Do not erase", he chalked above that basic simple piece of arithmetic.

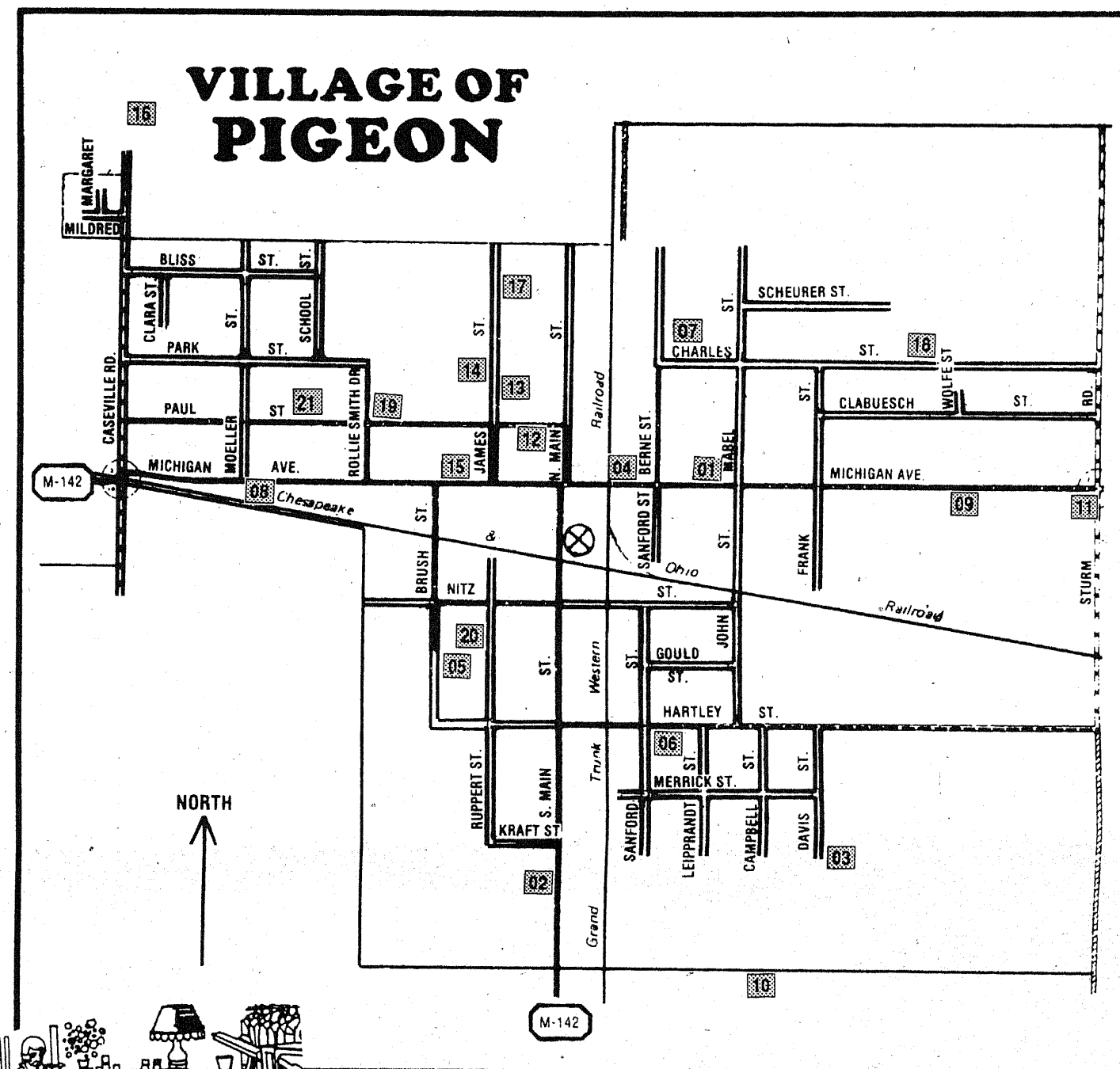
### CEMETERY SPACE CONCERNS

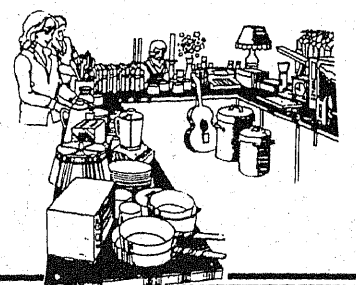

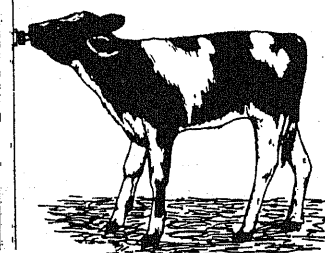

■ When small children want to help paint, hand them clean brushes and water to paint the sidewalks.

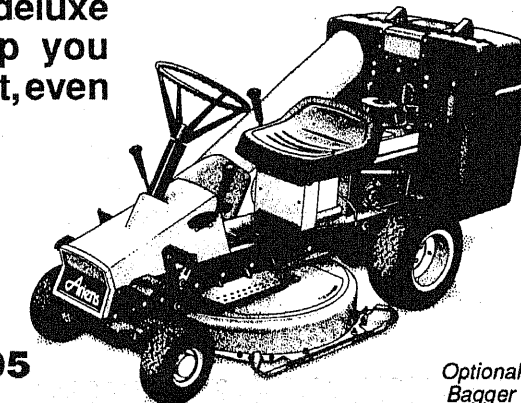
