



# Politics has changed in 20 years... for the worse

Possibly the most enlightening — yet disturbing — fact about U.S. elections was uncovered this week, and it spans two decades of political speeches, baby-kissing, promises and disappoint-

A national survey analyzed news coverage of political campaigns in 1968 and compared them with those of our most-recent presidential election, in 1988. It found that TV coverage of presidential candidates has changed dramatically.


In 1968, a typical average TV news "bite" lasted 26.5 seconds. That means a presidential hopeful had 35 to 50 words of "wisdom" to dispense, which usually means most of one thought pattern or platform could be discussed in a reasonable amount of depth.

But how long was the average TV news "bite" in our last presidential campaign, four years ago in 1988? A small total of 8.5 seconds.

That means we could only learn 10 to 12 WORDS of a person's platform. That's how President Bush's "Read my lips: no new taxes" made impressions, for instance. It was short on substance, had no depth, didn't convey more than one tiny point but it stood out in these hurrying days of multiple messages being thrown at us.

What's really happening is the homogenization of America. We're so wound up in our lives and concerns that we won't take the time to really get to know our presidential candidates. We remember smart little tid-bits, which helps influence our views - and voting. Then, politicians keep repeating those messages on TV, radio and in papers until we form our entire opinions.

We should be ashamed we aren't willing to invest

And the parking lot is full of beautifully appointed demo trailers from all the major dealers and manufacturers. A day could be spent in itself just walking through them all, admiring the new styles, testing doors and latches, and day dreaming.

It is an understatement indeed to say there is a great deal to see and do, learn and experience at the annual Horse Expo in Lansing, and it is understated equally to say that The Michigan Horse Council and its members work very hard to bring a show of this calibre to the good horse-folks of Michigan! Kudos to them for a job more than well done!

# Why Do You Want To Plant A Garden Anyway?

Reasons for gardening are gies and mulch, irrigation as plentiful as mushrooms after a warm spring rain. Get a bunch of gardeners together and ask them why they garden and you'll probably get at least as many reasons as there are gardeners.

Tom Stebbins, Master Gardener specialist at Michigan State University, meets a lot of gardeners who want to become better gardeners, and he agrees that people garden for a variety of reasons.

"Recreation is a big one," he says. "People grow gardens because they enjoy it. It gives them a chance to get outdoors, get some exercise and lower their stress level."

Gardening satisfies a creative urge for some people, he observes. It gives them a chance to take a few raw materials — soil, seed or plants, water and fertilizer and create something that wasn't there before. Whether the results is an edible harvest or a visual display or some combination of the two, it can generate feelings of accomplishemnt and satisfaction.

Every garden is unique, Stebbins notes, because every year offers a different combination of weather, pests and disease problems. The gardener can vary the crops planted and experiment with planting stratesystems and fertilizer schedules, too, so there's no end to the possible variations.

"New varieties come out every year, so there's always something new to try,' Stebbins points out.

As gardeners branch out from the familiar to try growing new possibly more demanding crops, they continue to expand their knowledge of plants and how to grow them. A garden, then, is a source of continuing education.

For some families, gardening brings the generations together.

It's hard to beat gardening as a family project," Stebbins suggests. "Choosing crops and varieties, planting and tending a vegetable garden or flower bed, and enjoying the results pro-vide opportunities for everyone, from the youngest to the eldest, to get involved."

Some people try gardening for a year or two and then quit. Reasons for quitting tend to sound like the flip side of reasons for gardening: too much work, not enought time, pest problems or bad weather - poor results, in other words - and unrealistic unexpectations.

"A lot of these often boil down to jumping into gar-


Stehhins observes one who might have done just fine with two windowboxes, a 10- by 10foot vegetable garden, a trowel and a hoe starts instead with a 100- by 50-foot vegetable garden and flower beds lining a 40-foot driveway. By the time it becomes obvious that he or she can't possibly take care of all that cultivated space, the money's been spent to plant it. Trying to keep up with the weeding and watering—and later the harvesting and preserving or giving away the produce—becomes frustrating and stress-producing rather than enjoyable. The garden becomes just another overwhelming demand, and the guilt over one's inability to meet that demand can end any desire to ever garden

His advice to novice gardeners: think small. If you think you can handle a 50-by 50-foot garden, plant half that space.

'If you're into garduning for the enjoyment of it, don't vuin it for yourself by turning it into a job that's bigger than you can handle," he advises. "A small garden that you feel good about is better - better for you - than a large garden that's making you feel guilty or frustrated.



# Signals Point To Good Spring Steelhead Runs

Strong fall spawning runs and a fairly mild winter are two indications pointing to a good spring steelhead migration in the state's rivers and streams.

This year's annual migration should equal or better last year's, say state fisheries biologists contacted for the 1992 AAA Michigan steelhead guide.

In addition to the strength of fall runs and mild weather, survival and return rates of stocked fish have improved since the state began planting larger fish in streams in the mid-1980's.

A check of nine West Michigan ports showed last year was best for steelhead catches in Lake Michigan since surveying began in

Steelhead, rainbow trout that live in the Great Lakes, are scrappy fish that average 5 to 12 pounds. The fish return to spawn in the stream where they were planted or

hatched

AAA Michigan's guide lists 57 sites where the best steelhead action is expected this spring. The best time to fish sould be from mid-March in Southwestern Michigan to mid-May in the Upper Peninsula.

Spawning steelhead are normally found in the main current of a river. Anglers often use a sack containing salmon eggs or the roe from a captured steelhead as bait. They bump the spawn bag along the stream bottom near rocks, stumps or other obstructions, places where steelhead often gather or rest.


Other successful baits include flies, fluorescent yarn, lures with contrasting colors or bright-colored artificial spawn. These excite or aggravate the fish into taking

the bait since spawning steelhead are not interested in feeding.

Anglers can help the Michigan Department of Natural Resources (DNR) track planted steelhead by turning in the heads of steelies missing the adipose fin. These marked steelhead contain a coded wire tag detailing the history of the fish.

Anyone catching a marked steelhead should record its size, date and location. Freeze the head and drop it off at any DNR office or selected bait shops.

For information on size, catch, season and consumption information, check the 1992 Michigan Fishing Guide, available at DNR offices or where fishing licenses are sold.
