## Thumb E 9-1-1 system almost here

A Tri-County Enhanced 9-1-1 (E 9-1-1) emergency phone system is inching closer to reality, with one Tuscola County community already on line and a second expected to receive service

The rest of Tuscola, Huron and Sanilac Counties are expected to have service by

The Millington phone exchange of 871 has joined and is operating under Tuscola County's E 9-1-1 system.

The Fostoria exchange of "795," which is part of the Millington's Wolverine Telephone Co., is expected to go on line in the next few days. Millington's exchanges were able to go on line with

because the community was originally part of Genessee County's 9-1-1 system and all of the necessary equipment is in place.

With Tuscola County developing its own E 9-1-1 system now, persons in the 871 phone exchange will have their 9-1-1 calls ring into Tuscola's Central Dispatch.

"The idea of the field testing is to make sure we have an error rate of less than one percent."

Huron County police officers will be only ones to activate the tests of the 9-1-1 system for a spot check of the data base.

The Tri-County E 9-1-1 plan cost per telephone number has been determined to be 36 cents per month per telephone number, says Tuscola Sheriff Thomas Kern.

"This breaks down as 21 cents per line for recurring costs and 15 cents per line for a maximum of five years for non-recurring costs," Kern says, noting this is good news for Thumb residents because the original projected cost was 84 cents.

After the non-recurring costs are paid, the 36-cent price will reduce to 21 center per month per line to provide E 9-1-1 service.

"County-wide E 9-1-1 (system) availability remains set for late in March 1993," says Kern. This is because other phone exchanges have to make necessary equipment changes for the system to operate.

The Thumb Counties of Tuscola, Huron and Sanilac were the first in the state to join together to cooperatively apply for funding to bring the emergency phone service to a region. The effort netted them a \$180,000 grant to implement the systems.

"We went together as three counties to produce more telephone customers to get a better rate," says Gage.

"Huron County has a few less phone customers than

#### Michigan By the Numbers" Car/deer crashes

Car/deer crashes in Michigan reached 48,233 in 1991, an all-time high record, and an increase of 5% over 1990, officials say. The crashes caused seven fatalities and 1,732

The 1990 mark was 45,945 crashes, one death and 1,957 injuries. In 1989, the previous peak year, there were 46,784 crashes, six deaths and 1,857 injuries.

Most crashes occur in the fall or early winter, in breeding season and as many deer are moving away from hunters. Up to 760,000 firearm deer hunters will be in the woods Nov. 15-30, experts say and this year's deer herd is estimated at 1.75 million.

The average repair bill for a car/deer crash is \$1,300 per car, says Automobile Club of Michigan.

#### Contract talks continue

As the first marking period of the 1992-93 school year approaches, some Western Thumb Area school districts remain without teachers' contracts.

The most critical situation in Huron County is the Elkton-Pigeon-Bay Port "Laker" School District, says Tri-County Bargaining Association President Penny Letts. She heads the bargaining organization which represents 19 school

Laker negotiation members declared they are at an impasse and asked for mediation. The first mediation meeting is scheduled for Thursday, Nov. 19. The State Mediator assigned to the district is William Borusushko.

"Bargaining has been slow there," said John Folsom, Michigan Education Association (MEA) Uniserv Director, who is overseeing the Laker District. "We are still having problems over finances, salary, fringes, calendar, length of school year, and a carrier for health benefits. The contract expired

There are about 70 teachers and 1,292 students in the district.

The Owendale-Gagetown School District's teachers did have a tentative agreement, but are back bargaining again over some points, he said. "They are going back to bargain-

### Mutual Savings earnings rise

Mutual Savings Bank announced earnings of 77 cents per share for the quarter ending Sept. 30, according Wendell Evans, Jr., chairman of the board and chief executive officer.


"We are very pleased to announce these favorable earnings because they represent our first quarter as a public company, and they exceed the projections of the bank's offering circular," said Evans.

### No criminal charges to be filed against former teacher

of former Laker band instructor Vincent Aiello, 27 of Pigeon, last week, Huron County Prosecutor Leslie Hagen says no criminal charges would be brought against him.

Aiello resigned his position at a special school board meeting after being accused of engaging in "sexually inappropriate contact with at least two female students."

Hagen said a full investigation was conducted and several Laker students were interviewed.

After reviewing the complaints, the prosecutor said charges could have been brought on at least one of the complaints, but that after discussing the case with one of

the victims and her family, the decision was made to ask for Aiello's resignation and to have him seek counseling.

Aiello was suspended with pay from the school on Sept. 18 after charges were filed against him with the school board by Laker High School Principal Lisa DiCamillo.

In a prepared statement, Hagen gave credit to the Laker administration for its handling of the case and to DiCamillo for her prompt action in calling authorities.




