Kauffman will be spending her senior year at the Interlochen Arts Academy, though she has been enrolled at Lakers for the past 12 years.

Her decision for leaving was based on her love for the piano and wanting to learn more, which the school offers.

Interlochen specializes in fine arts. It is an independent, co-educational boarding school enrolling students in grades 9 - 12 with a post-



graduate year available.

Although the Academy specializes in fine arts, college-prep courses are also required. Interlochen hosts about 400 students during the school year coming from all 50 states and more than 13 other countries.

Kauffman's application included writing four 150-word essays, and a lot of paper work, she says.

An audition was also required and because of the many miles to Traverse City, she was able to record her audition consisting of three piano songs.

After her tape was heard, Kauffman received a phone call from Interlochen requesting a personal interview. For this, she had to play in front

of five professors as well as answer questions.

Her acceptance was based on her talent and intelligence, the school says.

Interlochen's term begins Sept. 11 though she will be leaving a few days before.

Classes are normally held Tuesday through Saturday with Sunday and Monday being their "week-end." Graduation commencement is scheduled for June 1.

Kauffman has been taking piano lessons from Pam Dubey for the past nine years during which she attended various music camps. In addition to the piano, she also enjoys playing trumpet and french horn.

She is the daughter of Cal and Nola Kauffman of Elkton.

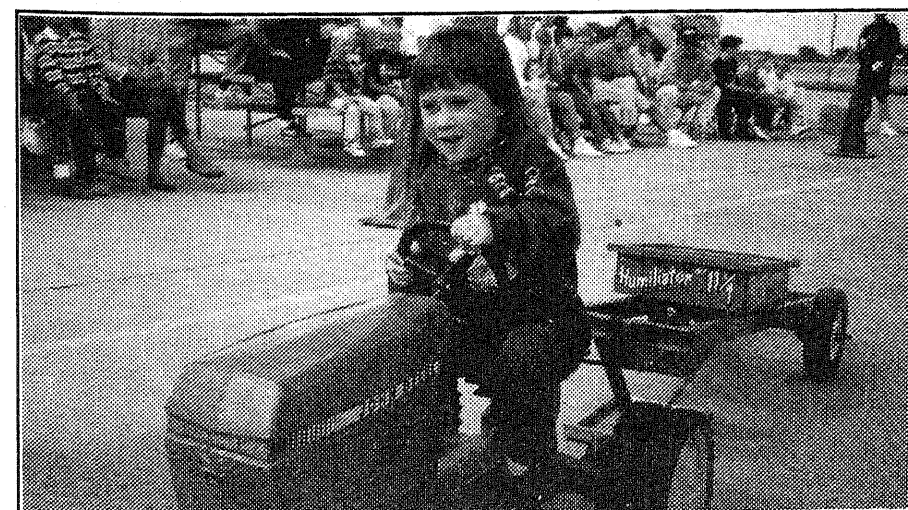

Col. Kisner still has strong Elkton roots, sharing ownership of the family farm with his sister, Judy Bannick, who lives in Elkton.

"Teresa never had anything bad to say about anyone. And we decided to set up the scholarship because we thought that's what Teresa would have wanted."

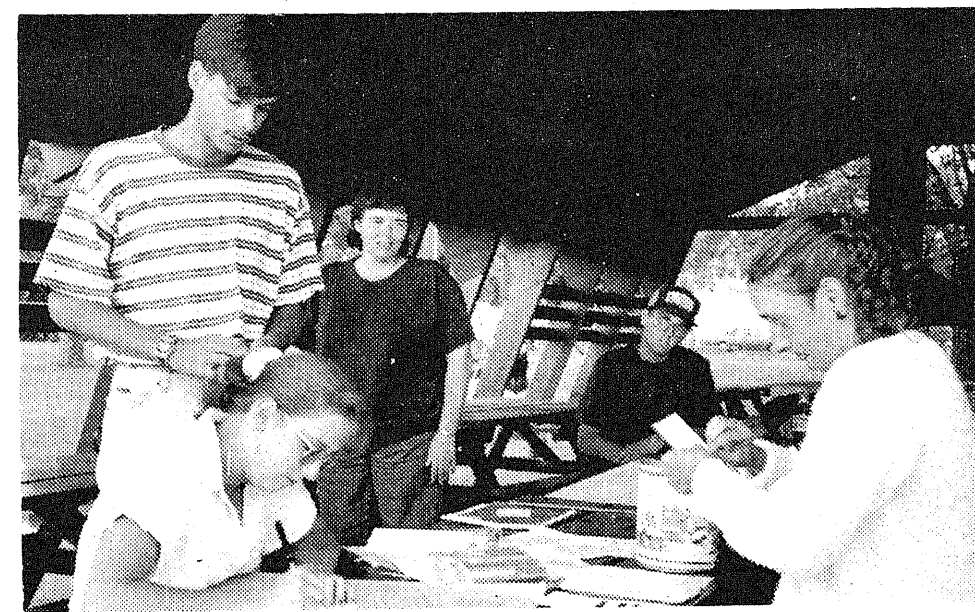
