aces, hands and booted feet. Faces are painted in flesh ones, antiqued, wiped off, 'blushed" and triple-sealed. Then glass eyes are inserted rom inside the heads, which reattached to the bodies and hen equipped with beards.

Elenbaum's beard and hair preparation requires that the nohair wool comes from the arst cutting of a year-old anzora goat. "That's when the wool is longest and finest,'

The wool is washed three imes and rinsed in water "as not as I can stand it." Then Santa's beard is meticulously 'ormed, combed, trimmed






