HINTS TO HORSEMEN.

[Revised Edifion.] If your horse is in the habit of kicking, use a low dash board, and your horse will soon get over it. Keep your horse fat; don't allow any

e to get a lien on him. When your horse refuses to take up an oat, consider him as having failed. A nail in a horse's foot often causes an ail there.

To make a horse fast, tie him Never feed horse chestnuts to chestnut horses, nor horse sorrel to sorrel horses you can give cream to a cream horse, if you like and the horse likes it. It is not necessary to employ a cream pitcher to pitch hay to a cream horse, however. It may answer to stirrup your saddle, but don't stir up your horse-at least a stirruped horse-in a crowd. It might

Look carefully after the bits of your horse, or you may soon be looking after the bits of your wagon. If you have the proper address, you may receive a couple of lines from a horse, but on no account "drep a line. However well attached you may be to
