



[Bev. W. H. Felix in Western Becorder.] Ex-Senator Jesse D. Bright had never made a profession of religion, but he had often been the subject of deep religious conviction. He often spoke of his intention to become a Christian some day Several months ago he invited me to go up to his mine, in West Virginia, and hold a meeting. 
