### A Mysterious Death.

One of the most remarkable and mys ville, Ind. A German named Leyer, a farmer in Warrick County, thirty miles from Evansville, was arrested last De cember, charged with poisoning the cis-tern of a neighbor named Frederick Cook, from the effects of which Mrs. Cook. and numbers of the surrounding community, were poisoned, and Mrs. Cook died. Mobs attempted to hang Leyer twice, but he escaped, and was brought to Evans-ville for trial. An analysis of the cistern water, mud, and a substance found on the curbing and in the stomach of the deceased discovered arsenic in deadly quantities in the articles, but none wa ound in the stomach.

Leyer was tried and the defense held that the absense of arsenic in the stomach was proof that she was not poisoned and that the arsenic was placed in the cistern after her death, by the enemies of Leyer. Expert medical testimony of was convicted by a jury and sentenced to the penitentiary for life. The next day he attempted suicide by the cutting of his wrist with a bit of glass. It was discovered and his life saved. He grew gloomy and dispondent.

# Wisconsin Lumber.

The Mississippi Valley Lumberman Pays: The certainty of a large shortage of the log crop continues to force itself upon the lumberman, in spite frantic effort of the loggers to defeat the ordering of Previdence and keep down the price of lumber. Advices from the upper Mississippi shows that 100,000,000 feet at least have been banked on this river and the Rum, which is about twothirds of the estimate and one-half the amount cut last year. The St. Croix will probably fall a little short of as much more, and will get a little less proportion of her usual crop, probably from 80,000,000 to 90,000,000 feet.

From the Chippewa and its tributaries the shortage is probably a little larger than on either of the others, and as m is the great source of supply in the West, the principal falling off, feet, will come from this stream. We estimate that probably not over two-fifths of the usual cut will be made. We are not so fully advised concerning the Wisconsin, but reports show that they will not reach above the average of the other streams. The Black River is definitely set down for 75,000,000, against nearly 200,000,000 last year. The footing, so far, shows that the Mississippi River and its tributaries will fall short of last year's cut about as fel

By railroad mills we intend to include all the mills from the Northern Pacific down to those on the Milwaukee and St Paul in the lower pineries, and we place low estimate on the shortage from the lack of any definite information.

To this shortage is to be added the difficulty of driving, which now promises to be serious. This mild weather ises to be serious. This mild weather has not only wasted the snow, but is rapidly taking up the water from the country, so that it is to be expected that we will have very low water on all the streams. Rain water would be the only dependence, and would have to fall in unusual quantities to secure good driv ing, especially on the small brooks where the slow and tedious work comes.
