

An extra passenger train collided with freight on the Vandalia Line at Clear Creek Frestie, nine miles west of Terre Hante on the 24th last. The extra was two hours and fifteen minutes late, but the conductor read it "two hours fifty minutes," hence the collision. At the point where the collision occurred there is a sharp curve, and a trestle about forty-five feet high, approached by high embankments. 
