

Packages re habitually carried. One rider took a piece of timber, four by two inches and twelve feet long, half a mile; this was done for convenience, not for sport, and the same person regularly carries packages of hardware weighing fifteen ounds or more. In a five months' trip as agent for a firm dealing in manufacturer's supplies through parts of the New England States, he has traveled his bicycle, carrying his bundle of samples over 3,000 miles, averaging thirty miles a day, frequently going ten miles withont dismounting, and visiting all mills and manufacturing concerns on the route. He claims that he accomplished this distance in less time than he would have done by rail, beside penetrating dis-
