



VISITING NORVELL. Where People Baise Cucumbers Celery-Fly Kites and live a Contented Life.

The citizens of our neighboring village are pretty busy now taking care of their cucumbers, celery, etc., but they found time on Saturday afternoon to indulge a childish pastime at kite flying. Even the popular Sir Knight Esculapeus, took a hand and gave the boys some practical hints on the construction of kites as practiced in Canada when he was a tender youth. We do not think it detracts one whit from a man's dignity to spend an hour at the pleasurable pastime. It is not every one who can successfully fly a kite. Just the same not everyone makes a success at business, but the Norwell people seem to "get there" and are

contented and happy. By invitation of our friend, Dr. Hyndman, we had the satisfaction of visiting his celery grounds just northeast of the village. A few years ago an unsightly piece of marsh surrounded by rolling land, with an outlet or ditch at the south end, occupied about one-eighth of a 40acre piece next to the highway. The doctor purchased the land for a pasture but found the marsh so wet that a man could not with safety cross it. Looking the matter over with the practical eye that has brought most of his enterprises to a successful termination, he thought that by a system of draining he could make a valuable piece of land out of this peat bed, and at once set to work. As he progressed he found springs at the upper part from which flowed an abundance of water. A tall of about five feet allowed him to soon reclaim the land and put it under cultivation. At the same time should there be a dry season, he can quickly throw a dam across the ditch at the lower end and flood the whole tract.

This is recognized as a valuable feature in a celery farm. All who have investigated the matter know that with proper drainage and the application of a little fertilizer the marshes of southern Michigan will produce almost any vegetable in marvelous quantities.

The genial doctor did much by way of experiment, for although he found plenty of friends who had had abundance of experience in raising celery-Dr. Stewart, of Tecumseh, for instance, yet he would not be satisfied to follow close in their footsteps, but prefered to demonstrate certain theories of his own, though attended by a considerable outlay.

He has erected a stone building 113x33 feet to be used as a storage and packing house. It is fitted up according to the latest plans for ventilation, drainage, etc., and is supplied with water for washing. It is sheltered by a circle of hills from the storms of winter, yet is accessable to the celery grounds and the highway.

He now has about three acres under cultivation and as much more that can be easily prepared should he desire it.

From there we went to the river bottoms east of the village, where Henry Beckwith has several acres of land under cultivation, a part of it now being in celery, corn, buckwheat, etc. All the land is excellent for celery and he can irrigate it with little trouble. He is now ready to put a portion of his crop on the market. His favorite variety is the White Plume.






