THE MAJESTY OF THE LAW.

Again Invoked by Those Cannot Agree.

Is social standing to be recognized in courts of law? This is a fair question which has been raised in a bill of complaint recently filed in the county clerk's office. Joseph McMahon of Manchester died a few months ago, leaving a will which bequeathed to his children property amounting to \$24,000.

The son, John A. McMahon, it is claimed, secured an undue advantage, and the administrator has brought suit against him on behalf of the other heirs. H., and that she is still residing there, that another sister, Ann Gaige, is to be addressed as Mrs. Prof. Gaige of the university of Michigan located at Ann Arbor, U.S.A. 
