The monstrous drudgery of the life of the private soldier, in time of peace, is not with American temperament. If the routine can be made interesting or improving, or if the troops could be used for exploration, the army would attract young men of a different grade.

It must always be remembered that there are no such things as republic institutions as we understand the term in the states of South and Central America. The form of government may vary according to the needs or the interests of the nation in question, but a republic as the United States is a republic cannot exist in South America.

They have come here because they thought this country was better than the native land, and if they are to enjoy it, they should be ready to support the institutions not only in war, where many of them have already shown their devotion, but in peace as well. Let them cherish the memory of their ancestors and of the land that gave them birth if they will, but teach them that their first duty is to the land that shelters them, supports them, and educates them, and encourage them to identify themselves with it. With a little stronger safeguard drawn around to prevent the entrance of an undesirable class, and a little better education, the foreigners of this country are as ready to support the institutions as the native-born.
