

MINOR MICHIGAN NEWS.

A society for the prevention of cruelty to animals has been organized at Ann Arbor.

The managers of Whitney & Andrews circus left their people stranded at South Haven.

A nine-year-old son of Joseph Stanek fell from the dock at Traverse City and was drowned.

The eighth annual reunion of the Seventh Michigan Infantry will be held at Leslie, June 12.

A lodge of the American Railway Union, with 35 members, was organized at Benton Harbor.

The corner stone for the new feeble-minded asylum, at Lapeer, will probably be laid on June 26.

Mr. Oran Parker of Amy, joined by his son, his brother, and his wife, jumped out of his buggy at Pontiac and broke his neck. She died instantly.

Mrs. Adelbert Hecox, near Howell, tried to suicide with arsenic. Married four months, family troublous.

M. L. Flick, of Cincin. Ill., was instantly killed at Marshall by being thrown under an express train.

Gen. Wendt, a prominent business man of Saginaw Center, fell dead while working in his furniture store.

The 10-year-old daughter of Lars Nelson, near Morley, was brutally assaulted by a tramp in the woods.

Description of the Craft Which Is Now the Sensation of Europe—Progress in Domestic Industries—Notes and Comment.

Lieut. H. H. L.
