WORKINGMAN'S LAW APPLIES TO CITIES

PERSONS INJURED WHILE IN EM-
PLOY OF MUNICIPALITIES ARE
ENTITLED TO COMPEN-
SATION.

Some Cases Have Been Set-
tled Without Reporting
to State.

All Settlements Must Be Forwarded to
the State Board at Lansing, and
Approved by the Board.

The state industrial accident board
is interested in knowing that
injured men are going to be
entitled to compensation paid employees in
jured while in the employ of the
municipalities.

The board has recently called to
the attention of the board two acci-
dents from Detroit where men were
injured while in the employ of the
city. One was employed in the col-
lection division of the garbage de-
partment, the other in the employ of the
department of public works. The state board has
been appealed to in both cases.

The board of compensation has com-

voters are enrolled in Marshall this
