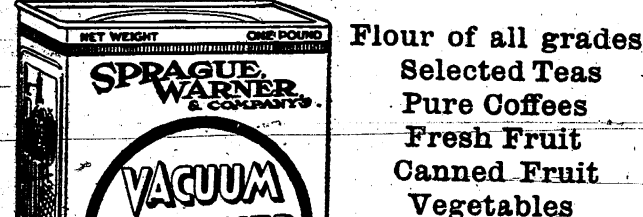

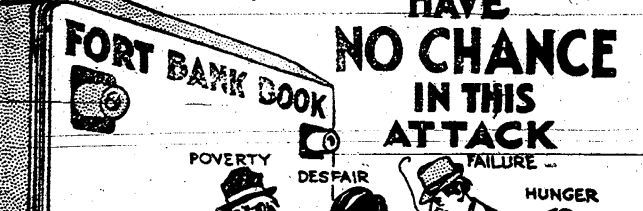

NEW AUTO TAX LAW

TO NET LARGE SUM

SECRETARY OF STATE COMPLETES FIGURES FROM MANUFACTURERS' REPORTS.

WILL AVERAGE \$13 PER CAR

Almost Two Millions of Dollars is Estimated as Amount Motor Owners Will Pay for 1916

Lansing—The Newell Smith auto tax law will net the state of Michigan and its component counties close to \$1,750,000 during the first year of its operation, 1916.

The law calls for a tax of 25c a horsepower and for 25c a one-hundredth of weight. When state officials began to make inquiries, the manufacturers were opened.

The ordinary Ford car, under figures received here, will cost each owner \$12.50 a year.

Of this money, \$11 for his license, the larger cars are averaged in, it is figured by Deputy Secretary of State George L. Smith that the average will run close to \$12.

So far this year there have been five months of operation of the new law.

The opinion prevails in the automobile license bureau—that the number will reach 150,000. On the basis of splitting the difference between the \$11 and \$13 average, making it \$12 a figure which is very conservative—the total amount of money taken in would be \$1,800,000.

Of this money, one-half will go to the counties in which it originates.

Some days ago Secretary Vaughan took to the manufacturers and asked for figures as to horsepower and weight on all makes of machine, and varied models for the last 10 years.

The data from the manufacturers will be compiled in a book and a copy sent to each applicant for a license, so that he can figure out his own fee.
