Upon receipt of such affidavit in the time specified herein, the clerk shall write in the registration book the name of the applicant together with the other information required by this chapter and such applicant shall thereupon be deemed to be duly and properly registered.

Note—If this acknowledgment is taken outside the state the certificate of the court that the person making the acknowledgment is a duly qualified elector must be attached. Registration of Absentee by Oath: If any person whose name is not registered shall offer and claim right to vote at any election or primary election, and shall, under oath, state that he is a resident of the township, village or city of such precinct and has resided in days next preceding such election as designated particularly the place of his residence, and that he or she possesses the other qualifications of an elector under the con-

stitution, and that, owing to the sickness or bodily infirmity of himself or of some member of his family, or owing to his absence from the township, village or city on public business or his own business, and without intent to avoid or delay his registration, he was unable to make application for registration on the last two days provided by law for the registering of electors preceding such election or primary election. If such applicant shall, in said matter, willfully make and false statement, he shall be deemed guilty of perjury. PROVIDED, That any city may provide by its charter or by resolution approved by a majority of the members of its legislative body for the registration of such sick and absent voters on the last Saturday preceding any election or primary election at the places of voting in the several voting districts of such city. Instead of on election or primary election day. (See Sec. 9 Part III, Chap. III of Act 351 as amended 1935.) All the provisions relative to registration in Townships and

Cities shall apply and be in force as to registration in Villages.
